A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 64 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 municipal and county recreation systems, so as to provide that where a minimum recreation
3 tax, maximum recreation tax, or minimum and maximum recreation tax has been established
4 by petition and referendum, such minimum or maximum or both may thereafter be removed
5 by action of the municipal or county governing body, subject to approval by the voters of the
6 municipality or county; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal
7 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

9 **SECTION 1.**

10 Chapter 64 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to municipal and
11 county recreation systems, is amended by adding a new Code section as follows:

12 "36-64-15.

13 (a) If a municipality or county has adopted the provisions of this chapter at an election,
14 thereby establishing a minimum recreation tax, a maximum recreation tax, or a minimum
15 and maximum recreation tax, then such minimum or maximum or both may be removed
16 as provided in this Code section.

17 (b) In order to so remove the minimum or maximum or both, the governing body of the
18 municipality or county shall adopt a resolution to that effect, subject to approval by a
19 majority of the voters of the municipality or county at the next general or special election
20 of the municipality or county which is held more than 45 days after the date of the adoption
21 of the resolution by the governing body. Such resolution shall specify the ballot language
22 to be used in presenting the question and the governing body shall provide a copy of the
23 resolution to the appropriate election officials. If a majority of the voters voting on the
24 question of removal vote in favor, the minimum or maximum or both shall be removed as
25 presented to the voters.

1 (c) Where a minimum or maximum or both has or have been removed as authorized by
2 this Code section, the amount of municipal or county funding for the recreation system of
3 the municipality or county shall thereafter be determined by the governing body of the
4 municipality or county in its discretion."

5 **SECTION 2.**

6 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
7 without such approval.

8 **SECTION 3.**

9 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
