## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring and remembering the life of Reverend Hulon Hill; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Reverend Hulon Hill was born on April 21, 1940, in Gwinnett County, Georgia;  
3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, he was married for 47 years to Sara Everett Hill and together they raised two  
5 sons and a daughter; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he served his country in the United States Army, fighting in the Korean War;  
7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, his ministry began at Trinity Methodist Church, and continued at Level Creek  
9 Methodist Church in Gwinnett County; McKee's Chapel, Wesley Chapel, and Pleasant  
10 Grove, all of the Upper Dawson Circuit in Dawsonville; New Liberty and Ebenezer Churches  
11 in Habersham County; Norwood, Johnson, and Prospect Churches in Warren County;  
12 Bethany United Methodist Church in Jefferson, Georgia, where he served for 24 years; and  
13 finally to Center United Methodist Church in Hoschton, Georgia; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Reverend Hill was a pastor to hundreds of families and individuals who were  
15 not members of his church, or any church, by ministering wherever there was a need, and he  
16 was loved and respected by everyone who knew him.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
18 the members of this body joins together to express their deepest regret at the passing of  
19 Reverend Hulon Hill and extend their most sincere condolences to his family and friends.
