Senate Resolution 820 By: Senators Mullis of the 53rd and Tolleson of the 20th

A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Joint Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement Study Committee; and

2 for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, the Department of Natural Resources law enforcement responsibilities are 4 critical to public safety, homeland security, and protection of our natural resources; and

5 WHEREAS, that law enforcement responsibility of the department is divided into two 6 categories, one established in Code Section 27-1-16, relating to conservation rangers, and 7 one established in Code Section 27-1-17, relating to the authority of the Board of Natural 8 Resources to appoint deputy conservation rangers; and

9 WHEREAS, there is a need to review the laws relating to the Department of Natural 10 Resources law enforcement to determine whether any reform, revision, or modernization of 11 such laws is necessary and appropriate so as to better fulfill the purposes of such laws and 12 the public safety, homeland security, and natural resource protection needs of this state.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 GEORGIA that there is created the Joint Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement Study Committee to be composed of ten members as follows: five members of the Senate to 15 16 be appointed by the President of the Senate, one of whom shall be the chairperson of the Senate Public Safety Committee who shall serve as cochairperson of the committee and one 17 18 of whom shall be the chairperson of the Senate Veterans Affairs, Military and Homeland 19 Security Committee; and five members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by 20 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be the chairperson of the 21 House Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security who shall serve as cochairperson 22 of the committee. The cochairpersons shall call all meetings of the committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the conditions,
needs, issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action

or legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate. The committee may 1 2 conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or 3 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The members of the committee 4 5 shall receive the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of 6 Georgia Annotated. All funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds appropriated to the House of Representatives and the Senate. The expenses 7 and allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member of the 8 9 committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. In the event the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations, with suggestions for 10 proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December 1, 2008. The 11 12 committee shall stand abolished on January 1, 2009.
