## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

| 1  | To amend Code Section 16-9-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the   |

| 2  | crime of knowingly manufacturing, selling, or distributing false identification documents,  |
| 3  | so as to change the penalties for such offense based upon the age of the person convicted and   |
| 4  | the nature of the crime; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to provide   |
| 5  | for applicability; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.  |

| 6  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:   |
| 7  | SECTION 1.  |
| 8  | Code Section 16-9-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the crime of   |
| 9  | knowingly manufacturing, selling, or distributing false identification documents, is amended  |
| 10 | by revising subsection (c) as follows:  |
| 11 | "(c)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) or (3) of this subsection, any person who   |
| 12 | violates the provisions of paragraph (1), (2), (3), or (6) of subsection (b) of this Code   |
| 13 | section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.   |
| 14 | (2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, any Any person who violates   |
| 15 | <u>the provisions of paragraph <math>(2)</math>, <math>(3)</math>, or <math>(6)</math> of subsection (b) of this Code section for the</u> |
| 16 | second or any subsequent offense shall be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by a   |
| 17 | fine of not more than \$25,000.00 or by imprisonment for not more than three years, or  |
| 18 | both.   |
| 19 | (3) Except as provided in paragraph (5) of this subsection, any Any person who  |
| 20 | manufactures, alters, sells, distributes, delivers, receives, possesses, or offers for sale or  |
| 21 | distribution three or more identification documents in violation of the provisions of   |
| 22 | subsection (b) of this Code section shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than   |
| 23 | three nor more than ten years, a fine not to exceed the amount specified by Code Section  |
| 24 | $\frac{17-10-8}{100,000.00}$ , or both.   |
| 25 | (4) Except as provided in paragraph (3) or (5) of this subsection, any Any person who   |
| 26 | violates <u>the provisions of</u> paragraph $(1), (2), (4)$ or (5) of subsection (b) of this Code   |

| 1  | section shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years,        |

| 3  | (5) Any person who is under 21 years of age and violates the provisions of subsection            |
| 4  | (b) of this Code section for the purpose of the identification being used to obtain entry        |
| 5  | into an age restricted facility or being used to purchase a consumable good that is age          |
| 6  | restricted, shall, upon a first conviction thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon a        |

| 9  | (5)(6) Any person convicted of an attempt or conspiracy to violate the provisions of             |

| 14 | This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2008, and shall apply to all offenses committed       |
| 15 | on or after that date.   |
