3 WHEREAS, Mr. Charles McKenzie "Mack" Taylor was born in Opelika, Alabama; and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Taylor was a graduate of Auburn University in Alabama; and

5 WHEREAS, he served in the United States Navy and Naval Reserve after graduating from6 college; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taylor began his career as a cotton broker in Opelika, Alabama, but he
moved to Atlanta in 1967 and helped to launch the real estate boom that now dots the
skyline; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taylor is credited with shaping Atlanta's ritzy Buckhead neighborhood, and
during the 1970s and 1980s, he was one of Atlanta's leading commercial real estate
developers with his late partner Harvey Mathis; and

WHEREAS, their firm, Taylor and Mathis, developed Buckhead Plaza, a skyscraper which
sits at the center of the upscale neighborhood and was one of the area's first tall buildings;
and

16 WHEREAS, novelist Tom Wolfe, a good friend of the Taylors, credits Mr. Taylor as the 17 reason he wrote his 1998 book, *A Man in Full*; and

18 WHEREAS, he had a great love for his wife and children.
