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The House Committee on Appropriations offers the following substitute to HB 887:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 13 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 tobacco product manufacturers, so as to provide for the creation of the Tobacco Prevention
- 3 Master Settlement Agreement Oversight Committee; to provide for its composition, powers,
- 4 and duties; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Chapter 13 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to tobacco product
- 9 manufacturers, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "10-13-5.
- 11 (a) There is created the Tobacco Prevention Master Settlement Agreement Oversight
- 12 Committee within the Department of Human Resources to be composed of the following:
- 13 (1) Two citizen members appointed by the Governor with some type of expertise in the
- field of tobacco prevention and education or smoking cessation;
- 15 (2) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
- 16 House;
- 17 (3) Two members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 18 (4) A tobacco prevention expert from the Department of Human Resources appointed
- by the commissioner of human resources;
- 20 (5) A tobacco prevention expert from the Department of Community Health appointed
- by the commissioner of community health;
- 22 (6) The following additional members appointed by the Governor:
- 23 (A) A tobacco prevention expert from the federal Centers for Disease Control and
- 24 Prevention;
- 25 (B) A representative from a school of public health from a university within the State
- of Georgia;

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- 1 (C) A representative from the American Cancer Society;
- 2 (D) A representative from the American Lung Association;
- 3 (E) A representative from the American Heart Association;
- 4 (F) A representative from the Medical Association of Georgia; and
- 5 (G) A representative from the Georgia State Medical Association.
- 6 (b) Members appointed by the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and
- 7 the Lieutenant Governor shall be appointed to terms of two years each. However, for the
- 8 purpose of providing staggered terms, of the Governor's initial appointments, four
- 9 members shall be appointed for two-year terms and five members shall be appointed for
- 10 four-year terms.
- 11 (c) Any vacancy on the oversight committee shall be filled in the same manner as the
- original appointment, and any member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring because of
- death, resignation, or ineligibility for membership shall serve only for the unexpired term
- of the member's predecessor. A member shall be eligible for reappointment.
- 15 (d) Members of the oversight committee that serve in the Georgia General Assembly shall
- receive the same compensation, per diem, expenses, and allowances for their service on the
- 17 committee as is authorized by law for members of interim legislative study committees.
- 18 (e) The oversight committee shall meet at least quarterly and upon the call of the
- 19 chairperson.
- 20 (f) The oversight committee shall:
- 21 (1) Determine the most effective means of establishing clear and meaningful lines of
- communication between the oversight committee and the public and private sectors in
- order to ensure that the process of developing and implementing the state tobacco control
- strategy has afforded a broad spectrum of the public and private sectors an opportunity
- 25 to comment and make recommendations;
- 26 (2) Review and make recommendations to the Governor and the legislature on funding
- 27 tobacco prevention and education programs and services; the oversight committee may
- recommend the creation of a separate appropriations category for funding services
- delivered or procured by applicable state agencies and may recommend the use of
- 30 performance based contracting;
- 31 (3) Review various tobacco prevention and education programs and recommend, where
- 32 appropriate, measures that are sufficient to determine program outcomes; the oversight
- committee shall review different methodologies for evaluating programs and determine
- whether programs within different state agencies have common outcomes;
- 35 (4) Review the tobacco control strategies and programs of, and efforts by, other states
- and the federal government and compile the relevant research with emphasis given to the

- 2 as they may be periodically amended;
- 3 (5) Recommend to the Governor and the legislature applied research projects that would
- 4 use research capabilities within this state, including, but not limited to, the resources of
- 5 institutions of the board of regents, for the purposes of achieving improved outcomes and
- 6 making better-informed strategic budgetary decisions within the budget;
- 7 (6) Recommend to the Governor and the legislature changes in law which would remove
- 8 barriers to, or enhance the implementation of, this state's tobacco prevention strategy;
- 9 (7) Make recommendations to the Governor and the legislature on the need for public
- information campaigns to be conducted in this state to limit tobacco consumption;
- 11 (8) Encourage implementation of a coordinated, integrated, and multidisciplinary
- response to the tobacco use problem in this state, with special attention given to creating
- partnerships within and between the public and private sectors, and to the coordinated,
- supported, and integrated delivery of multiple-system services for tobacco users,
- including a multiagency team approach to tobacco prevention and education; and
- 16 (9) Review the original Master Settlement Agreement to assess Georgia's continued
- 17 commitment to tobacco prevention programs and the treatment of smoking related
- illnesses.
- 19 (g) The oversight committee shall submit to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of
- 20 Representatives, and the Lieutenant Governor, by December 1 of each year, a report which
- 21 contains a summary of the work of the committee during that year and the
- recommendations required pursuant to subsection (f) of this Code section. Interim reports
- 23 may be submitted at the discretion of the chairperson of the oversight committee."

SECTION 2.

- 25 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 26 without such approval.

SECTION 3.

28 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
