

Senate Bill 562

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
2 regulation of alcoholic beverages generally, so as to provide for the cancellation of licenses
3 to sell alcoholic beverages upon a conviction of providing any alcoholic beverage to a person
4 under 21 years of age; to define a term; to provide for applicability; to provide for related
5 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Chapter 3 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the regulation of
9 alcoholic beverages generally, is amended by revising Code Section 3-3-23.1, relating to
10 procedures and penalties upon certain violations, by adding a new subsection to read as
11 follows:

12 "(g) When a licensee under this title or a person who is in the employ of a licensee under
13 this title is convicted of providing any alcoholic beverage to a person under 21 years of age
14 in violation of paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of Code Section 3-3-23, then such licensee's
15 license or licenses under this title and the license or licenses issued for the premises where
16 such violation occurred shall be canceled. Before the cancellation of any license pursuant
17 to this subsection, the licensee or the holder of the license for the licensed premises shall
18 be afforded a hearing with an opportunity to present evidence and cross-examine opposing
19 witnesses. No license to sell alcoholic beverages shall be issued to the licensee or for the
20 licensed premises for a period of two years from the date of the cancellation. For purposes
21 of this subsection, 'licensed premises' means any premises in which alcoholic beverages are
22 sold or dispensed and shall include any premises which are required by law to be licensed
23 to sell or dispense alcoholic beverages."

1 **SECTION 2.**

2 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
3 without such approval and shall apply to any offense committed on or after such date.

4 **SECTION 3.**

5 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
