A RESOLUTION

1 Expressing regret at the tragic passing of Sedrick Harrington, Agena Battle, and Aliyah
2 Battle; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, Sedrick Harrington and twins Agena and Aliyah Battle were among the most
4 precious gifts that God has given to their family and to the residents of Columbus, Georgia;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, they were loved immensely as proud and shining examples of enduring hope
7 and affection to all who knew them; and

8 WHEREAS, the senseless shootings have shocked and horrified the nation and left the quiet
9 community of Columbus in a state of mourning as we all try to find answers to this tragedy;
10 and

11 WHEREAS, there are simply no words adequate to heal the anguish which the untimely
12 passing of these children has caused in the hearts and lives of their families and friends; the
13 thoughts, condolences, and prayers of all Georgians go out to the victims and their families
14 in the hope that healing may somehow lessen the pain of that terrible day.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
16 the members of this body express their deepest and most profound regret at the tragic and
17 untimely deaths Sedrick Harrington and Agena and Aliyah Battle.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
19 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the family of Sedrick
20 Harrington and Agena and Aliyah Battle.
