

The House Committee on Rules offers the following substitute to SB 480:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to scholarships, loans, and grants, so as to change certain definitions; to repeal
3 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 **SECTION 1.**

6 Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
7 scholarships, loans, and grants, is amended by revising subparagraph (A) of paragraph (2)
8 of Code Section 20-3-411, relating to definitions relative to tuition equalization grants at
9 private colleges and universities, as follows:

10 "(A) A nonproprietary institution of higher education located in this state which is not
11 a branch of the university system; which is accredited by the Southern Association of
12 Colleges and Schools; which is not a graduate level school or college of theology or
13 divinity; and which is not presently receiving state funds under Article 4 of this chapter;
14 provided, however, that an institution which otherwise meets the requirements of this
15 definition and of this subpart except for the lack of accreditation by the Southern
16 Association of Colleges and Schools shall be deemed to be an 'approved school' during
17 the period that the institution holds candidate for accreditation status with the Southern
18 Association of Colleges and Schools; provided, further, that an institution which was
19 previously accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools within the
20 last seven years and which otherwise meets the requirements of this definition and of
21 this subpart except for the lack of accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges
22 and Schools shall be deemed to be an 'approved school';"

23 **SECTION 2.**

24 Said article is further amended by revising paragraph (6) of Code Section 20-3-519, relating
25 to definitions relative to HOPE scholarships and grants, as follows:

1 "(6) 'Eligible high school', until December 31, 2010, means a public or private secondary
2 school which is:

3 (A) Located in Georgia and is currently or within the last two years has been accredited
4 ~~as such~~ by:

- 5 (i) The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 6 (ii) The Georgia Accrediting Commission;
- 7 (iii) The Georgia Association of Christian Schools;
- 8 (iv) The Association of Christian Schools International;
- 9 (v) The Georgia Private School Accreditation Council; or
- 10 ~~(vi) The Accrediting Commission for Independent Study; or~~
- 11 ~~(vii) The Southern Association of Independent Schools; or~~

12 (B) Located in another state and accredited by one of the following regional agencies:

- 13 (i) The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 14 (ii) The New England Association of Schools and Colleges;
- 15 (iii) The Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 16 (iv) The North Central Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 17 (v) The Northwestern Association of Schools and Colleges;
- 18 (vi) The Western Association of Schools and Colleges;
- 19 (vii) The Alabama Independent School Association; or
- 20 (viii) The Southern Association of Independent Schools.

21 On and after January 1, 2011, 'eligible high school' means a public or private secondary
22 school which is:

23 (A) Located in Georgia and accredited as such by:

- 24 (i) The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 25 (ii) The Georgia Accrediting Commission;
- 26 (iii) The Georgia Association of Christian Schools;
- 27 (iv) The Association of Christian Schools International;
- 28 (v) The Georgia Private School Accreditation Council;
- 29 (vi) The Accrediting Commission for Independent Study; or
- 30 (vii) The Southern Association of Independent Schools; or

31 (B) Located in another state and accredited by one of the following regional agencies:

- 32 (i) The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 33 (ii) The New England Association of Schools and Colleges;
- 34 (iii) The Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 35 (iv) The North Central Association of Colleges and Schools;
- 36 (v) The Northwestern Association of Schools and Colleges;
- 37 (vi) The Western Association of Schools and Colleges;
