A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing and commending Joyce Brookshire; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Joyce Brookshire's music is a portrait of her life and the life of her community,
- 3 the Cabbagetown Mill Village in the heart of downtown Atlanta, where she was born and
- 4 raised; and
- 5 WHEREAS, in the 1880's folks from the North Georgia mountains moved to Atlanta and
- 6 began to work at the Fulton Bag and Cotton Mill, and Joyce's family was among those who
- 7 brought their rural way of life to build a new community in the city; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Joyce's musical influences were many, including her father, a truck driver, who
- 9 played guitar and sang in a quartet at the family church; neighbor Grace Mote, who played
- 10 Kitty Wells and Webb Pierce on one of the first record players in the neighborhood; and the
- 11 rhythm and blues and rock and roll music of the 1950's; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Joyce began writing songs at age ten and hasn't quit since; and
- WHEREAS, in the early 1970's Joyce went to work at The Patch, a drop-in center for kids
- 14 in crisis in the Cabbagetown neighborhood, and it was there that she met Esther LeFever,
- 15 who was to have a major impact on Joyce's life as she was a folk singer, political activist,
- 16 ex-Mennonite, and friend to the poor and disadvantaged and greatly nurtured Joyce's talent
- as a songwriter and performer; and
- 18 WHEREAS, in the 1970's and 1980's Joyce toured with folk legend Guy Carawan and lived
- 19 in the Knoxville, Tennessee, area for several years playing with her band the Phantoms of
- 20 the Opry with Phyllis Boyens, who played Loretta Lynn's mother in the movie *Coal Miner's*
- 21 Daughter; and

1 WHEREAS, Joyce has used her songs to express not only her own feelings, but to become

- 2 a voice for the hungry, the homeless, and the poor; and
- 3 WHEREAS, along with the Indigo Girls and other noted Atlanta musicians, Joyce is featured
- 4 on the infamous Don't Eat Out of Dented Cans album produced by WRFG Radio; and
- 5 WHEREAS, her music has been featured in the theatrical productions *Cabbagetown: Three*
- 6 Women, Ponce de Leon, Blood on Blood, and Texas Two-Stepping with the Girls; and
- 7 WHEREAS, in 1987 she was nominated for a Georgia Emmy for outstanding achievement
- 8 in original music; and
- 9 WHEREAS, her first solo album, North Georgia Mountains, was released in 1977 by Foxfire
- 10 Records; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Joyce, known as the "Empress of Cabbagetown" and its best known advocate
- 12 and celebrity, continues to tell her wonderful stories through her music.
- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 14 commend Joyce Brookshire's outstanding contributions as a talented and successful
- songwriter and performer and as a magical storyteller through song.
- 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 17 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to Joyce Brookshire.
