

## House Resolution 2172

## A RESOLUTION

1 Urging the Clayton County Board of Education to uphold the oath taken by its members and  
2 make its first and overarching priority the education and well being of the students of the  
3 school system.

4 WHEREAS, the Clayton County school system faces severe unrest and troubling questions  
5 about its management, including a threatened loss of accreditation by the Southern  
6 Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS); and

7 WHEREAS, there exists a grave lack of confidence in the board in broad segments of the  
8 community; and the first of nine corrective actions identified by SACS is the need for the  
9 school system to establish a governing board that is capable of fulfilling its roles and  
10 responsibilities ; and

11 WHEREAS, under the Constitution of the State of Georgia the provision of an adequate  
12 public education for the citizens is a primary obligation of the State of Georgia; and nothing  
13 is more important to the future of our state than the education of our young people; and

14 WHEREAS, all public officers take a solemn oath to support the constitutions of the United  
15 States and this state.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
17 this body does hereby urge the Clayton County Board of Education to uphold the oath taken  
18 by its members and make its first and overarching priority the education and well being of  
19 the students of the school system.

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
21 and directed to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to each member of the Clayton  
22 County Board of Education.
