

House Bill 790 (AS PASSED HOUSE AND SENATE)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 holidays and observances, so as to declare the third week in October "School Bus Safety  
3 Week"; to make certain findings of fact; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

5 style="text-align:center">**SECTION 1.**

6 WHEREAS, every day, a fleet of yellow school buses carry Georgia's children to and from  
7 school; and

8 WHEREAS, the state's school buses comprise the state's largest mass transportation fleet,  
9 and each day during the school year, school buses make many passenger trips carrying the  
10 state's future—our children; and

11 WHEREAS, school buses meet higher construction, equipment, and inspection standards  
12 than any other vehicle, and school bus drivers meet higher qualification, training, and testing  
13 standards than any other drivers; and

14 WHEREAS, according to the National Academy of Sciences, an average of 820 students are  
15 killed annually during school transportation hours, but less than 2 percent of them are school  
16 bus passengers; and

17 WHEREAS, despite the industry's best efforts, accidents still happen; and

18 WHEREAS, "School Bus Safety Week," which is celebrated in more than 40 other states and  
19 sponsored by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, was created to remind all  
20 students of the best ways to get on and off the bus in an effort to enhance the safety of the  
21 nation's children; and

1 WHEREAS, "School Bus Safety Week," which dates back to 1966, also recognizes the hard  
2 work and dedication of school transportation personnel, especially the many school bus  
3 drivers who ensure a safe journey each and every day; and

4 WHEREAS, "School Bus Safety Week," celebrated the third week in October, promotes  
5 awareness through local and state poster and speech contests, lessons utilizing school bus  
6 safety community awareness kits, and other activities built around themes that raise  
7 awareness of school bus safety issues.

8 **SECTION 2.**

9 Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and  
10 observances, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

11 "1-4-17.

12 The third week in October of every year is designated 'School Bus Safety Week' in  
13 Georgia."

14 **SECTION 3.**

15 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
