A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 6 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to wine, so as to amend certain provisions relating to special order shipping licenses; to define a term; to limit the number of cases of wine shipped to any one consumer; to provide for certain taxes to be paid by the shipper of the wine; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7	SECTION 1.
8	Chapter 6 of Title 3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to wine, is amended
9	by revising Code Section 3-6-31, relating to special order shipping license requirements and
10	regulations, as follows:
11	"3-6-31.
12	(a) For purposes of this Code section, the term 'winery' means any maker or producer of
13	wine whether in this state or in any other state, who holds a valid federal basic wine
14	manufacturing permit.
15	(a)(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title to the contrary, a shipper, without
16	complying with the provisions of Code Section 3-6-22, any shipper which is also a winery
17	may be authorized to make direct shipments of wine to consumers in this state, without
18	complying with the provisions of Code Section 3-6-22, upon obtaining a special order
19	shipping license from the commissioner pursuant to this Code section.
20	(b)(c) A special order shipping license shall only be issued to a person who holds a valid
21	federal basic wine manufacturing permit and who is not otherwise licensed under this title,
22	winery upon compliance with all applicable provisions of this title and the regulations
23	promulgated pursuant to this title, and upon payment of the license fee designated for retail
24	dealers in Code Section 3-6-20.

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(c)(d) A special order shipping license shall entitle the shipper winery to ship wine upon 2 order directly to consumers for personal or household use in this state without designating

3 wholesalers as required by Code Section 3-6-22, provided that:

4 (1) The holder of a special order shipping license shall only ship brands of wine for 5 which he or she the holder has submitted labels to the commissioner;

6 (2) No holder of a special order shipping license shall be permitted to ship in excess of 50 12 standard cases of wine of one brand or a combination of brands into this state or 7 in excess of five cases of wine of one brand or a combination of brands to any one 8 9 consumer or address per calendar year;

(3) Before accepting an order from a consumer in this state, the holder of a special order 10 shipping license shall require that the person placing the order state affirmatively that he 11 or she is of the age required by Code Section 3-3-23 and shall verify the age of such 12 person placing the order either by the physical examination of an approved government 13 14 issued form of identification or by utilizing an Internet based age and identification 15 service;

16 (4) No holder of a special order shipping license shall accept any order for any wine that 17 is otherwise registered and designated pursuant to this title or from a person who is 18 licensed under A special order shipping license shall not authorize the shipment of any 19 wine to any premises licensed to sell alcoholic beverages pursuant to this title; and

- (5) Every shipment of wine by the holder of a special order shipping license shall be 20 21 clearly marked 'Alcoholic Beverages, Adult Signature Required,' and the carrier 22 delivering such shipment shall obtain be responsible for obtaining the signature of an adult who is at least 21 years of age as a condition of delivery. 23
- (d)(e) The failure to comply strictly with the requirements of this Code section, Code 24 25 Section 3-3-23, and all applicable provisions of this title and regulations promulgated 26 pursuant to this title shall be grounds for the revocation of a special order shipping license 27 or other disciplinary action by the commissioner. Upon revocation of a special order shipping license for shipment of wine to a person not of age as required by Code Section 28 3-3-23, such person winery shall not be issued any special order shipping license pursuant 29 to this Code section for a period of five years from the date of revocation. 30

(e)(f) The holder of a special order shipping license shall collect all excise taxes imposed 31 32 by Code Section 3-6-50, shall remit such taxes in the same manner as licensed wine wholesalers, and shall accompany such remittance with such reports, documentation, and 33 other information as may be required by the commissioner. In addition, an applicant for 34 and a holder of a special order shipping license, as a condition of receiving and holding a 35 valid license, shall: 36

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- 1 (1) Agree to collect and to pay applicable Georgia state and local sales tax on each sale 2 shipped to a consumer in Georgia; (2) Accompany each remittance with such sales tax reports, documentation, and other 3 information as may be required by the commissioner; and 4 5 (3) Consent to enforcement of the provisions of this Code section by the department and to the jurisdiction of the courts of Georgia for the collection of such taxes or other 6 7 moneys owing, including interest and penalties. 8 (f)(g) The commissioner may promulgate such rules and regulations as are necessary and 9 appropriate for the enforcement of this Code section."
