A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring the life of Reverend Henry Grady Jarrard and dedicating an intersection in his
2 memory; and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, many times civic and community leaders have been honored for their service
4 and contributions to their communities by having streets, roads, buildings, or bridges named
5 for them, and Reverend Henry Grady Jarrard is worthy of such an honor; and

6 WHEREAS, he lived a life of service to Hall County by serving as Hall County School
7 Superintendent for about 30 years, and he brought great change in the school system by
8 starting the comprehensive schools that are a vital part of the Hall County community today;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, he served as Pastor of New Holland Baptist Church for 37 years, and as school
11 superintendent and pastor he touched the lives of thousands of young people that have made
12 Hall County a great community; and

13 WHEREAS, the people of the New Holland Community can testify to the interest that
14 Preacher Jarrard had in the development of the young people of the community and how he
15 gave sacrificially of his time and means to that end; and

16 WHEREAS, it is only fitting and proper that a lasting memorial to his life of service be
17 established.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 GEORGIA that this body hereby honors the life of service of Reverend Henry Grady Jarrard
20 and dedicates the intersection of Jesse Jewell Parkway and Quarry Street in Hall County as
21 the Rev. H.G. Jarrard Memorial Intersection.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is authorized and
23 directed to erect and maintain appropriate signs dedicating the Rev. H.G. Jarrard Memorial
24 Intersection.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
26 and directed to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the family of Reverend Henry
27 Grady Jarrard and the Department of Transportation.
