

The House Committee on Transportation offers the following substitute to HR 1446:

## A RESOLUTION

1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution so as to provide that members of the State  
2 Transportation Board shall be elected to serve a term of two years; to provide for submission  
3 of this amendment for ratification or rejection; and for other purposes.

4 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:**

### 5 **SECTION 1.**

6 Article IV, Section IV, Paragraph I of the Constitution is amended by revising subparagraph  
7 (a) as follows:

8 "(a) There shall be a State Transportation Board composed of as many members as there  
9 are congressional districts in the state. The member of the board from each congressional  
10 district shall be elected by a majority vote of the members of the House of Representatives  
11 and Senate whose respective districts are embraced or partly embraced within such  
12 congressional district meeting in caucus. The members of the board in office on ~~June 30,~~  
13 ~~1983~~ December 31, 2010, shall not serve out the remainder of their respective terms but  
14 shall serve only until their successors are elected and qualified. The General Assembly  
15 shall provide by law the procedure for the election of members and for filling vacancies on  
16 the board. Members shall serve for terms of ~~five~~ two years and until their successors are  
17 elected and qualified."

### 18 **SECTION 2.**

19 The above proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be published and submitted as  
20 provided in Article X, Section I, Paragraph II of the Constitution. The ballot submitting the  
21 above proposed amendment shall have written or printed thereon the following:

22 "( ) YES Shall the Constitution of Georgia be amended so as to provide that members  
23 ( ) NO of the State Transportation Board shall be elected to serve for a term of two  
24 years?"

25 All persons desiring to vote in favor of ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "Yes."

26 All persons desiring to vote against ratifying the proposed amendment shall vote "No." If

27 such amendment shall be ratified as provided in said Paragraph of the Constitution, it shall  
28 become a part of the Constitution of this state.
