A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the outstanding accomplishments of Charles O. Walker; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, Charles O. Walker was born in Atlanta, Georgia, on February 17, 1929; and
- 3 WHEREAS, after graduating from Russell High School in East Point, Georgia, he earned a
4 BCS in Social Science from Georgia State University in Atlanta, Georgia, a Master of
5 Divinity from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, and has done
6 additional graduate study at the University of Georgia in Athens, Georgia; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Charles served in the United States Army in the early 1950's and was honorably
8 discharged; and
- 9 WHEREAS, he began service at the First Baptist Church of Jasper, Georgia, as Pastor on
10 April 1, 1960, and he worked there for 37 years before retiring on March 31, 1997, at which
11 time he was named Pastor Emeritus of the church; and
- 12 WHEREAS, he is a renowned local artist with many paintings and drawings, especially of
13 older buildings and dwellings, on display in homes, offices, and businesses in the North
14 Georgia area; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Charles is the author of at least eleven books, including church and family
16 histories, Baptist and other religious and denominational histories, and histories of the early
17 Cherokees in and near North Georgia. The books on Cherokees include representative
18 drawings of buildings and artifacts done by Reverend Walker. Originals of these drawings
19 are on display at the Chief Vann House, a Georgia State Historical Site and at the Cherokee
20 Heritage Center in Tahlequah, Oklahoma; and
- 21 WHEREAS, he is considered an expert on the "Old Federal Road" in North Georgia; and

22 WHEREAS, Charles served for ten years, from 1970-1980, on the Board of Commissioners
23 Housing Authority, City of Jasper, Georgia; and

24 WHEREAS, he helped start, and currently serves as president of, the Jasper, Georgia, chapter
25 of AARP and is also a member and former president of the Marble Valley Historical Society;

27 WHEREAS, his denominational service includes: Moderator of the Etowah Baptist
28 Association of Churches (Cherokee and Pickens counties, Georgia) (two terms); Chairman,
29 History Committee, Georgia Baptist Convention (three terms); President of the Georgia
30 Baptist Historical Society (three terms); Member of the Historical Commission of the
31 Southern Baptist Convention; Member of the Executive Committee of the Georgia Baptist
32 Convention (four terms); Vice President of the Georgia Baptist Convention; and helping to
33 start the McAfee School of Theology (a part of Mercer University) in Atlanta, Georgia.

34 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
35 the members of this body recognize the outstanding accomplishments of Charles O. Walker
36 and wish him continued good health and further success in the coming years.
