A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 6 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the state auditor, so as to revise and change certain provisions regarding the
- 3 operation, maintenance, and reporting requirements applicable to a public information
- 4 website of the Department of Audits and Accounts; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 2 of Chapter 6 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 9 state auditor, is amended by revising Code Section 50-6-32, relating to the operation,
- 10 maintenance, and reporting requirement applicable to a public information website of the
- 11 Department of Audits and Accounts as follows:
- 12 "50-6-32.
- 13 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Transparency in
- 14 Government Act.'
- 15 (b) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 16 (1) 'Agency' means:
- 17 (A) Each each department, commission, authority, and agency of the executive branch
- 18 of state government; and
- 19 <u>(B) The the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia;</u>
- 20 (C) Any regional educational service agency;
- 21 (D) The General Assembly, including all legislative offices and agencies; and
- (E) Local boards of education.
- 23 (2) 'Department' means the Department of Audits and Accounts.
- 24 $\frac{(2)(3)}{(2)}$ 'Searchable website' means a <u>single</u> website that allows the public to review and
- analyze information identified in subsection (c) of this Code section.

(c)(1) The No later than January 1, 2009, the department shall develop and operate a

27 single searchable website accessible by the public, at no cost, that provides the following 28 information pertaining to state fiscal year 2008 and each state fiscal year thereafter: (1)(A) The State of Georgia Comprehensive Annual Financial Report that includes an 29 indexed statement of operations and a statement of financial condition of the state in 30 accordance with governmental generally acceptable accounting principles; 31 (2)(B) The annual Budgetary Compliance Report for the state that provides, by agency, 32 an indexed report comparing budgeted and actual revenues and expenditures by 33 34 budgetary units for each organization included in the General Appropriations Act, as amended. Such report shall include, at a minimum, a statement of the taxes and other 35 revenues remitted to the state treasury and operating revenues retained by the agency 36 during the immediately preceding fiscal year as well as a statement of total expenditures 37 made by the agency during the immediately preceding fiscal year; 38 39 (3)(C) The annual State of Georgia Single Audit Report that provides, by federal grant, an indexed listing of all expenditures of federal funds and also discloses by state 40 organization any audit findings and corrective actions to be taken; 41 42 (4)(D) Salaries and expenses of full-time and part-time employees and board members; 43 (5)(E) A list of consultant expenses and other professional services expenses; 44 (6)(F) State Budget in Brief, indexed by reporting agency; and 45 (7)(G) All performance audits conducted by the department for the preceding five 46 years; and 47 (H) An indexed listing of all agencies and end users receiving any federal pass-through moneys and an itemized enumeration of the expenditure of such moneys. 48 49 (2) As soon as is practical after the close of each fiscal year, the department shall update 50 the single searchable website for such fiscal year to include the information set forth in 51 paragraph (1) of this subsection. 52 (d)(1) The No later than January 1, 2010, the department shall develop and add to the searchable website a report of certain grant and contract payments made or due to 53 vendors by agencies reporting through the state's general financial accounting and 54 information system and all payments made through economic and incentive programs 55 operated by the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Labor, the 56 57 Department of Community Affairs, the Department of Agriculture, and the Georgia Lottery Corporation pertaining to state fiscal year 2009 and each state fiscal year 58 thereafter. Such report shall include, at a minimum: 59 (1)(A) A list of all obligations entered into by the agency during the immediately 60 preceding fiscal year which call for the agency to expend at any time in the aggregate 61 62 more than \$50,000.00; and

63 (2)(B) A list of the names of each person, firm, or corporation that has received from 64 the agency during the immediately preceding fiscal year payments in excess of 65 \$20,000.00 in the aggregate, including the amount paid to such person, firm, or 66 corporation during such period.

- 67 (2) As soon as is practical after the close of each fiscal year, the department shall update 68 the single searchable website for such fiscal year to include the information set forth in 69 this subsection.
- 70 (3) Offices of the judicial branch shall provide the information required by agencies under this subsection.
- 72 (e) All agencies of state government shall provide to the Department of Audits and
- Accounts such information as is necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Code section.
- 74 (f) Nothing in this Code section shall require the disclosure of information which is 75 considered confidential by state or federal law."

76 SECTION 2.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
