A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
2 Annotated, relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, so as to establish the HOPE needs
3 based scholarship; to provide for a definition; to provide for eligibility requirements; to
4 provide for scholarship amounts; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;
5 and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Part 7 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
9 relating to HOPE scholarships and grants, is amended by adding a new paragraph to Code
10 Section 20-3-519, relating to definitions, to read as follows:

11 "(13.1) 'HOPE needs based scholarship' means a Helping Outstanding Pupils
12 Educationally needs based scholarship for education awarded in accordance with Code
13 Section 20-3-519.4."

14 **SECTION 2.**

15 Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 20-2-519.4, which is reserved, as
16 follows:

17 "20-3-519.4.

18 (a) To be eligible for a HOPE needs based scholarship, a student seeking an associate or
19 baccalaureate degree at an eligible public postsecondary institution shall:

20 (1) Meet residency requirements by:

21 (A) Meeting the requirements to be classified as a legal resident of Georgia as
22 established by the program regulations promulgated by the Georgia Student Finance
23 Commission which shall be based upon the in-state tuition policy of the board of
24 regents and the in-state tuition guidelines set by the Technical College System of
25 Georgia; and

26 (B)(i) If the student was classified as a legal resident of Georgia at the time of
 27 graduation from high school or from a home study program meeting the requirements
 28 of Code Section 20-2-690, then the student must have met the requirements set forth
 29 in subparagraph (A) of this paragraph for a period of at least 12 months immediately
 30 prior to the first day of classes for which the HOPE scholarship is to be awarded; or
 31 (ii) If the student was not classified as a legal resident at the time of graduation from
 32 high school or from a home study program meeting the requirements of Code Section
 33 20-2-690, then the student must have met the requirements set forth in subparagraph
 34 (A) of this paragraph for a period of at least 24 months immediately prior to the first
 35 day of classes for which the HOPE needs based scholarship is to be awarded.

36 Notwithstanding the foregoing, a dependent child of military personnel stationed in
 37 Georgia shall be deemed to be a legal resident of Georgia and, subject to meeting all other
 38 eligibility requirements, shall be eligible to receive the HOPE needs based scholarship as
 39 a freshman if the student graduated from a high school located in Georgia or from a home
 40 study program meeting the requirements of Code Section 20-2-690 that is located in
 41 Georgia;

42 (2) Meet further eligibility standards established by the Georgia Student Finance
 43 Commission which shall be based on criteria aimed at serving the neediest students; and

44 (3) Be a recipient of federal educational assistance funds awarded under the federal Pell
 45 Grant Program for any academic term for which a HOPE needs based scholarship is
 46 sought under this Code section.

47 (b) Only full-time students who attend an eligible public postsecondary institution shall
 48 be eligible for a HOPE needs based scholarship under this Code section.

49 (c)(1) Except as set out in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a student may receive the
 50 HOPE needs based scholarship until the first of these events:

51 (A) The student has earned a baccalaureate degree; or

52 (B) The student has attempted at any postsecondary institution a total of 190 quarter
 53 hours or 127 semester hours.

54 (2) A student enrolled in an undergraduate or first professional degree program designed
 55 to be more than 190 quarter hours or 127 semester hours in length is eligible to receive
 56 the HOPE needs based scholarship for a total of 225 attempted quarter hours or 150
 57 attempted semester hours.

58 (d) Subject to appropriations by the General Assembly, the Georgia Student Finance
 59 Commission shall determine HOPE needs based scholarship award amounts, which may

60 be determined on a sliding scale based on income. It is the intent of the General Assembly
61 that the HOPE needs based scholarships awarded pursuant to this Code section be targeted
62 at the neediest students.
