A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and 1 2 traffic, so as to provide for safer bicycle riding for bicyclists and the motoring public; to provide for definitions; to change provisions relating to parking a motor vehicle; to change 3 provisions relating to traffic laws being applicable to bicycles; to change provisions relating 4 5 to the transporting of children under the age of one year on a bicycle; to change provisions relating to riding on roadways and bicycle paths; to change provisions relating to equipment 6 on bicycles; to legalize the use of recumbent bicycles; to provide for related matters; to 7 8 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.
Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is
amended by revising Code Section 40-1-1, relating to definitions, by revising paragraphs
(6.1) and (6.2) and adding a new paragraph to read as follows:
"(6.1) <u>'Bicycle lane' means a portion of the roadway that has been designated by striping</u> ,
pavement markings, or signage for the exclusive or preferential use of persons operating
bicycles. Bicycle lanes shall at a minimum be required to meet accepted guidelines,
recommendations, and criteria with respect to planning, design, operation, and
maintenance as set forth by the American Association of State Highway and
Transportation Officials.
(6.2) 'Bicycle path' means a right of way under the jurisdiction and control of this state
or a local political subdivision thereof designated for use by bicycle riders.
(6.2)(6.3) 'Bicycle trailer' means every device pulled by a bicycle and designed by the

25	Said title is further amended in Article 3 of Chapter 6, relating to driving on the right side of
26	the roadway, overtaking and passing, and following too closely, by adding a new Code
27	section to read as follows:
28	″ <u>40-6-55.</u>
29	Notwithstanding other provisions of this chapter relating to operating a vehicle on a
30	roadway, where a bicycle lane is provided on the roadway, the operator of a motor vehicle
31	shall yield to a person operating a bicycle in a bicycle lane and shall not block or impede

Said title is further amended by revising Part 1 of Article 13 of Chapter 6, relating to bicyclesand play vehicles, as follows:

58 The provisions of this part applicable to bicycles shall apply whenever a bicycle is operated
59 upon a highway, upon a bicycle lane, or upon any bicycle path set aside for the exclusive

- 62 (a) The provisions of this chapter that apply to vehicles, but not exclusively to motor
- 63 vehicles, shall apply to bicycles, except <u>as provided in this Code section and except</u> that
- 64 the penalties prescribed in subsection (b) of Code Section 40-6-390, subsection (c) of Code
- 65 Section 40-6-391, and subsection (a) of Code Section 40-6-393 shall not apply to persons
 66 riding bicycles.
- 67 (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Code Section 40-6-50, any person operating a
- 68 <u>bicycle may ride upon a paved shoulder; provided, however, that such person shall not be</u>
- 69 <u>required to ride upon a paved shoulder.</u>
- 70 (c) Any person operating a bicycle may signal a right turn with his or her right arm and
- 71 <u>hand extended horizontally or with his or her left hand and arm extended upward.</u> Such
- 72 person shall not be required to signal continuously if the operator's hand is needed to
- 73 <u>control the bicycle.</u>

- (a) A person propelling a bicycle shall not ride other than upon or astride a permanent and
- regular seat attached thereto and shall allow no person to ride upon the handlebars.
- (b) No bicycle shall be used to carry more persons at one time than the number for which
- it is designed and equipped.
- 79 (c) No person shall transport a child under the age of one year as a passenger on a bicycle 80 on a highway, roadway, bicycle path, bicycle lane, or sidewalk; provided, however, that 81 a child under the age of one year may be transported on a bicycle trailer or in an infant 82 sling so long as such child is seated in the bicycle trailer or carried in an infant sling 83 according to the bicycle trailer's or infant sling's manufacturer's instructions, and the 84 bicycle trailer is properly affixed to the bicycle according to the bicycle trailer's manufacturer's instructions or the infant sling is properly worn by the rider of the bicycle 85 86 according to the infant sling's manufacturer's instructions and such child transported in a 87 bicycle trailer or infant sling is wearing a bicycle helmet as required under paragraph (1) of subsection (e) of Code Section 40-6-296. 88 89 (d) No child between the ages of one year and four years shall ride as a passenger on a
- bicycle or bicycle trailer or be transported in an infant sling unless the child is securely
- 91 seated in a child passenger bicycle seat, bicycle trailer, or infant sling according to the child

- 92 passenger bicycle seat's, bicycle trailer's, or infant sling's manufacturer's instructions and
- 93 the child passenger seat or bicycle trailer is properly affixed to the bicycle according to the
- 94 child passenger bicycle seat's or bicycle trailer's manufacturer's instructions or the infant
- sling is worn according to the infant sling's manufacturer's instructions.
- 96 (e) Violation of subsections (c) and (d) of this Code section shall not constitute negligence
 97 per se nor contributory negligence per se or be considered evidence of negligence or

- 102 No person riding upon any bicycle, coaster, roller skates, sled, or toy vehicle shall attach

- 105 (a) <u>As used in this Code section, the term 'hazards to safe cycling' includes, but shall not</u>
- 106 <u>be limited to, surface debris, rough pavement, drain grates which are parallel to the side of</u>
- 107 <u>the roadway, parked or stopped vehicles, potentially opening car doors, or any other objects</u>
- 108 which threaten the safety of a person operating a bicycle.
- 109 (b) Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall ride as near to the right side of
- 110 the roadway as practicable, except when turning:
- 111 (1) Turning left or avoiding:
- 112 (2) Avoiding hazards to safe cycling, when the:
- 113 (3) The lane is too narrow to share safely with a motor vehicle, when traveling;
- 114 (4) <u>Traveling</u> at the same speed as traffic, or while exercising;
- (5) Exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same
 direction; or
- (6) There is a right turn only lane and the person operating the bicycle is not turning
 right;
- provided, however, that every person operating a bicycle away from the right side of the roadway shall exercise reasonable care and shall give due consideration to the other applicable rules of the road. As used in this subsection, the term 'hazards to safe cycling' includes, but is not limited to, surface debris, rough pavement, drain grates which are
- 123 parallel to the side of the roadway, parked or stopped vehicles, potentially opening car
- 124 doors, or any other objects which threaten the safety of a person operating a bicycle.
- 125 (b)(c) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway shall not ride more than two abreast except
- 126 on <u>bicycle</u> paths, <u>bicycle lanes</u>, or parts of roadways set aside for the exclusive use of

- bicycles, or when a special event permit issued by a local governing authority permits 127 riding more than two abreast. 128 129 (c)(d) Whenever a usable bicycle path has been provided adjacent to a roadway and designated for the exclusive use of bicycle riders, then the appropriate governing authority 130 may require that bicycle riders use such bicycle path and not use those sections of the 131 132 roadway so specified by such local governing authority. The governing authority may be 133 petitioned to remove restrictions upon demonstration that the bicycle path has become inadequate due to capacity, maintenance, or other causes. 134 135 (d)(e) Bicycle paths Paths subject to the provisions of subsection (c) (d) of this Code section shall at a minimum be required to meet accepted guidelines, recommendations, and 136
- 137 criteria with respect to planning, design, operation, and maintenance as set forth by the
- 138 American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials, and such <u>bicycle</u>
- paths shall provide accessibility to destinations equivalent to the use of the roadway.
- (f) Any person operating a bicycle in a bicycle lane shall ride in the same direction as
 traffic on the roadway.
- (e)(g) Electric assisted bicycles as defined in Code Section 40-1-1 may be operated on
 bicycle paths.

- 145 No person operating a bicycle shall carry any package, bundle, or other article which 146 prevents him <u>or her</u> from keeping at least one hand upon the handlebars.
- 147 40-6-296.
- (a) Every bicycle when in use at nighttime shall be equipped with a light on the front 148 149 which shall emit a white light visible from a distance of 300 feet to the front and with a 150 light on the back which shall emit a red reflector on the rear of a type approved by the 151 Department of Public Safety which shall be light visible from a distance of 300 feet to the rear when directly in front of lawful upper beams of headlights on a motor vehicle. A light 152 153 emitting a red light visible from a distance of 300 feet to the rear may be used in addition 154 to the red reflector. (b) Every bicycle sold or operated shall be equipped with a brake which will enable the 155
- 156 operator to make the braked wheels skid on dry, level pavement.
- 157 (c) No bicycle shall be equipped or operated while equipped with a set of handlebars so
- raised that the operator must elevate his <u>or her</u> hands above his <u>the operator's</u> shoulders in
- 159 order to grasp the normal steering grip area.

160 (d) No bicycle shall be equipped, modified, or altered in such a way as to cause the pedal

161 in its lowermost position to be more than 12 inches above the ground, nor shall any bicycle

162 be operated if so equipped.

- (e)(1) No person under the age of 16 years shall operate or be a passenger on a bicycle
 on a highway, bicycle path, <u>bicycle lane</u>, or sidewalk under the jurisdiction or control of
 this state or any local political subdivision thereof without wearing a bicycle helmet.
- (2) For the purposes of this subsection, the term 'bicycle helmet' means a piece of
 protective headgear which meets or exceeds the impact standards for bicycle helmets set
 by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) or the Snell Memorial Foundation.
- 169 (3) For the purposes of this subsection, a person shall be deemed to wear a <u>bicycle</u>
 170 helmet only if a <u>bicycle</u> helmet of good fit is fastened securely upon the <u>such person's</u>
 171 head with the straps of the <u>such bicycle</u> helmet.

(4) No bicycle without an accompanying protective bicycle helmet shall be rented or
leased to or for the use of any person under the age of 16 years unless that person is in
possession of a bicycle helmet at the time of the rental or lease.

- 175 (5) Violation of any provision of this subsection shall not constitute negligence per se
- nor contributory negligence per se or be considered evidence of negligence or liability.
- 177 (6) No person under the age of 16 failing to comply with any provision of this subsection
- 178 may shall be fined or imprisoned.

- 180 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell a new bicycle or a pedal for use on a bicycle
- 181 unless the pedals on such bicycle or such pedals are equipped with reflectors of a type

182 approved by the Department of Public Safety. The reflector on each pedal shall be so

- 183 designed and situated as to be visible from the front and rear of the bicycle during darkness
- 184 from a distance of 200 feet. The commissioner of public safety is authorized to promulgate

185 rules and regulations and establish standards for such reflectors.

- 186 (b) This Code section shall not apply to any bicycle purchased prior to July 1, 1972, by a
- 187 retailer for the purpose of resale.

- (a) It is shall be a misdemeanor for any person to do any act forbidden or fail to perform
 any act required in this part.
