AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 8 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to the alert system for unapprehended murder and rape suspects under the
- 3 administration of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, so as to create a state-wide "Blue
- 4 Alert" system to speed the apprehension of violent criminals who kill or seriously injure law
- 5 enforcement officers and to aid in the location of missing law enforcement officers; to
- 6 provide for definitions; to provide for procedure; to provide for related matters; to provide
- 7 an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

- 10 Article 8 of Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- alert system for unapprehended murder and rape suspects under the administration of the
- 12 Georgia Bureau of Investigation, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as
- 13 follows:
- *"*35-3-191.
- 15 (a) There is established a state-wide alert system known as 'Blue Alert' which shall be
- developed and implemented by the director.
- 17 (b) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 18 (1) 'Law enforcement agency' means a law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over
- the search for a suspect in a case involving the death or serious injury of a peace officer
- or an agency employing a peace officer who is missing in the line of duty.
- 21 (2) 'Peace officer' means a person who is certified to exercise the powers of arrest.
- 22 (c) The 'Blue Alert' system may be activated when a suspect for a crime involving the
- 23 <u>death or serious injury of a peace officer has not been apprehended and law enforcement</u>
- 24 personnel have determined that the suspect may be a serious threat to the public and also
- 25 when a peace officer becomes missing while in the line of duty under circumstances
- 26 <u>warranting concern for such peace officer's safety.</u>

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27 (d) The provisions of Code Sections 35-3-173, 35-3-175, and 35-3-178 shall also apply to

- 28 <u>'Blue Alert' as set forth in this Code section.</u>
- 29 (e) Upon notification by a law enforcement agency that a suspect in a case involving the
- death or serious injury of a peace officer has not been apprehended and may be a serious
- 31 <u>threat to the public, the director shall activate the 'Blue Alert' system and notify appropriate</u>
- 32 participants in the 'Blue Alert' system, as established by rule, if:
- 33 (1) A law enforcement agency believes that a suspect has not been apprehended;
- 34 (2) A law enforcement agency believes that the suspect may be a serious threat to the
- 35 <u>public; and</u>
- 36 (3) Sufficient information is available to disseminate to the public that could assist in
- 37 <u>locating the suspect.</u>
- 38 The area of the alert may be less than state wide if the director determines that the nature
- of the event makes it probable that the suspect did not leave a certain geographic location.
- 40 (f) Upon notification by a law enforcement agency that a peace officer is missing while in
- 41 <u>the line of duty under circumstances warranting concern for such peace officer's safety, the</u>
- 42 <u>director shall activate the 'Blue Alert' system and notify appropriate participants in the</u>
- 43 <u>'Blue Alert' system if sufficient information is available to disseminate to the public that</u>
- 44 <u>could assist in locating the missing peace officer. The area of the alert may be less than</u>
- 45 <u>state wide if the director determines that the nature of the event makes it probable that the</u>
- 46 <u>officer is within a certain geographic location.</u>
- 47 (g) Before requesting activation of the 'Blue Alert' system, a law enforcement agency shall
- 48 <u>verify that the criteria described by subsection (e) or (f) of this Code section have been</u>
- 49 <u>satisfied. The law enforcement agency shall assess the appropriate boundaries of the alert</u>
- 50 <u>based on the nature of the suspect and the circumstances surrounding the crime or the last</u>
- 51 <u>known location of the missing peace officer.</u>
- 52 (h) The director shall terminate any activation of the 'Blue Alert' system with respect to
- 53 <u>a particular incident if:</u>
- 54 (1) The suspect or peace officer is located or the incident is otherwise resolved; or
- 55 (2) The director determines that the 'Blue Alert' system is no longer an effective tool for
- 56 <u>locating the suspect or peace officer.</u>
- 57 <u>Law enforcement agencies shall notify the director immediately when the suspect is located</u>
- and in custody or the peace officer is found.
- 59 (i) Any entity or individual involved in the dissemination of a 'Blue Alert' generated
- 60 pursuant to this Code section shall not be liable for any civil damages arising from such
- 61 <u>dissemination.</u>"

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62 SECTION 2.

63 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2010.

SECTION 3.

65 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
