The Senate Public Safety Committee offered the following substitute to SB 295:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 1 of Chapter 14 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
relating to general provisions regarding the use of speed detection devices and traffic-control
signal monitoring devices, so as to require law enforcement agencies to report on fines
collected for speeding fines; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date;
to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.** 8 Article 1 of Chapter 14 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 9 general provisions regarding the use of speed detection devices and traffic-control signal 10 monitoring devices, is amended by adding a new subsection to Code Section 40-14-11, 11 relating to investigations by the public safety commissioner and suspension or revocation of 12 speed detection device permits, to read as follows: 13 "(e) In order to assist with the enforcement of this Code section, all law enforcement 14 agencies shall submit to the commissioner of community affairs, on an annual basis, a 15 report showing the amount of fines collected for speeding violations not exceeding 17 miles per hour over the established speed limit and the law enforcement agency's annual 16 budget." 17
