

The Senate Public Safety Committee offered the following substitute to SB 295:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 14 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,  
2 relating to general provisions regarding the use of speed detection devices and traffic-control  
3 signal monitoring devices, so as to require law enforcement agencies to report on fines  
4 collected for speeding fines; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date;  
5 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

**SECTION 1.**

7 Article 1 of Chapter 14 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
8 general provisions regarding the use of speed detection devices and traffic-control signal  
9 monitoring devices, is amended by adding a new subsection to Code Section 40-14-11,  
10 relating to investigations by the public safety commissioner and suspension or revocation of  
11 speed detection device permits, to read as follows:

13 "(e) In order to assist with the enforcement of this Code section, all law enforcement  
14 agencies shall submit to the commissioner of community affairs, on an annual basis, a  
15 report showing the amount of fines collected for speeding violations not exceeding 17  
16 miles per hour over the established speed limit and the law enforcement agency's annual  
17 budget."

**SECTION 2.**

18 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2010.

**SECTION 3.**

20 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
