

House Bill 1415

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 20-2-690.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to  
2 mandatory education for children between ages six and 16, so as to provide for  
3 reimbursement to the local school system for costs incurred to provide notice to parents and  
4 guardians; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

7 Code Section 20-2-690.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to mandatory  
8 education for children between ages six and 16, is amended by revising subsection (c) as  
9 follows:

10 "(c) Any parent, guardian, or other person residing in this state who has control or charge  
11 of a child or children and who shall violate this Code section shall be guilty of a  
12 misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not less than \$25.00  
13 and not greater than \$100.00, imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, community service,  
14 reimbursement to the local school system for the costs incurred to provide notice pursuant  
15 to this subsection, or any combination of such penalties, at the discretion of the court  
16 having jurisdiction. Each day's absence from school in violation of this part after the  
17 child's school system notifies the parent, guardian, or other person who has control or  
18 charge of a child of five unexcused days of absence for a child shall constitute a separate  
19 offense. After two reasonable attempts to notify the parent, guardian, or other person who  
20 has control or charge of a child of five unexcused days of absence without response, the  
21 school system shall send a notice to such parent, guardian, or other person by certified  
22 mail, return receipt requested. Public schools shall provide to the parent, guardian, or other  
23 person having control or charge of each child enrolled in public school a written summary  
24 of possible consequences and penalties for failing to comply with compulsory attendance  
25 under this Code section for children and their parents, guardians, or other persons having  
26 control or charge of children. The parent, guardian, or other person who has control or

27 charge of a child or children shall sign a statement indicating receipt of such written  
28 statement of possible consequences and penalties; children who are age ten years or older  
29 by September 1 shall sign a statement indicating receipt of such written statement of  
30 possible consequences and penalties. After two reasonable attempts by the school to secure  
31 such signature or signatures, the school shall be considered to be in compliance with this  
32 subsection if it sends a copy of the statement, via certified mail, return receipt requested,  
33 to such parent, guardian, other person who has control or charge of a child, or children.  
34 Public schools shall retain signed copies of statements through the end of the school year."

35 **SECTION 2.**

36 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
