AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to general provisions concerning health, so as to provide that no law or rule or
- 3 regulation shall compel any person, employer, or health care provider to participate in any
- 4 health care system; to authorize persons and employers to pay directly for lawful health care
- 5 services without penalties or fines; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective
- 6 date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 9 Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 10 general provisions concerning health, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as
- 11 follows:
- 12 <u>"31-1-11.</u>
- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Compel' includes penalties or fines.
- 15 (2) 'Direct payment' or 'pay directly' means payment for lawful health care services
- without a public or private third party, not including an employer, paying for any portion
- of the service.
- 18 (3) 'Health care system' means any public or private entity whose function or purpose is
- the management of, processing of, enrollment of individuals for, or payment for, in full
- or in part, health care services or health care data or health care information for its
- 21 <u>participants.</u>
- 22 (4) 'Lawful health care services' means any health related service or treatment to the
- 23 extent that the service or treatment is permitted or not prohibited by law or regulation that
- 24 <u>may be provided by persons or businesses otherwise permitted to offer such services.</u>
- 25 (5) 'Penalties or fines' means any civil or criminal penalty or fine, tax, salary or wage
- 26 withholding or surcharge, or any named fee with a similar effect established by law or

rule by a government established, created, or controlled agency that is used to punish or
 discourage the exercise of rights protected under this Code section.

- 29 (b) To preserve the freedom of citizens of this state to provide for their health care:
- 30 (1) No law or rule or regulation shall compel, directly or indirectly, any person,
- 31 employer, or health care provider to participate in any health care system; and
- 32 (2) A person or employer may pay directly for lawful health care services and shall not
- 33 <u>be required to pay penalties or fines for paying directly for lawful health care services.</u>
- A health care provider may accept direct payment for lawful health care services and
- 35 <u>shall not be required to pay penalties or fines for accepting direct payment from a person</u>
- or employer for lawful health care services.
- 37 (c) Subject to reasonable and necessary rules and regulations that do not substantially limit
- 38 <u>a person's options, the purchase or sale of health insurance in private health care systems</u>
- 39 <u>shall not be prohibited by law or by rule or regulation.</u>
- 40 (d) This Code section shall not:
- 41 (1) Affect which health care services a health care provider or hospital is required to
- 42 <u>perform or provide;</u>
- 43 (2) Affect which health care services are permitted by law;
- 44 (3) Prohibit care provided pursuant to any statutes enacted by the General Assembly
- 45 relating to workers' compensation;
- 46 (4) Prohibit the imposition by the General Assembly of conditions and limitations on the
- 47 <u>use or applicability of exemptions and deductions with regard to income taxation;</u>
- 48 (5) Affect laws or rules in effect as of January 1, 2009; or
- 49 (6) Affect the terms or conditions of any health care system to the extent that those terms
- and conditions do not have the effect of punishing a person or employer for paying
- 51 directly for lawful health care services or a health care provider or hospital for accepting
- 52 direct payment from a person or employer for lawful health care services."

53 SECTION 2.

- 54 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 55 without such approval.

SECTION 3.

57 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
