A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing the Civil Air Patrol for their service to the citizens of Georgia; and for other

2 purposes.

WHEREAS, the Civil Air Patrol was founded on December 1, 1941, as an organization of
volunteers to assist the United States military in national defense by performing aerial coastal
patrols and emergency services within the continental United States; and

6 WHEREAS, in 1943 the capabilities of this new volunteer organization were recognized as
7 vital to national defense, and by Presidential Executive Order, the Civil Air Patrol was
8 assigned to the War Department and was subsequently chartered by Congress to perform
9 three distinct missions - emergency services, aerospace education, and cadet programs; and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Wing of the Civil Air Patrol consists of over 1,800 volunteer
members in 42 squadrons and six groups located throughout this state; and

WHEREAS, members of the Georgia Wing of the Civil Air Patrol have consistently volunteered their services, time, and resources to serve as an intricate component of our national defense by conducting missions in homeland security, counter drug, disaster relief,

- 15 and search and rescue; and
- WHEREAS, Civil Air Patrol air and ground teams perform over 90 percent of inland search
 and rescue missions tasked by the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center; and
- WHEREAS, qualified aircrews were deployed to take aerial reconnaissance photos of flooddamage in northwest Georgia in September, 2009; and
- WHEREAS, Georgia Wing squadrons have been awarded the National Squadron ofDistinction in 2008 and 2009; and

- 22 WHEREAS, the estimated value of the Georgia Wing members' volunteer hours in 2009 was
- 23 \$4.2 million; and

WHEREAS, these "flying minutemen" of the Civil Air Patrol have, since its inception,
consistently provided this state with invaluable emergency services, aerospace education, and
cadet programs.

- 28 the members of this body recognize the selfless contributions the volunteers of the Civil Air
- 29 Patrol have made to the State of Georgia.
