- 15 Politics Unfiltered, Jason Pye.com, Peach Pundit, and SWGA Politics regularly keep the
- 16 citizens of this state briefed on the inner-workings of state government.

- 18 this body commends Georgia's political bloggers for their unique role in promoting openness
