

ADOPTED

Senator James of the 35th offered the following amendment:

1 *Amend the Senate Judiciary Committee substitute to HB 1322 (LC 29 4347S) by inserting*
 2 *after "exceptions;" on line 3 the following:*

3 to provide for exemption from disclosure of certain law enforcement and emergency
 4 response records which contain audio or video recordings of personal suffering;

5 *By replacing "a new paragraph" with "two new paragraphs" on line 8.*

6 *By striking line 10 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:*

7 "(2.1) Records of a law enforcement agency, an emergency 9-1-1 system, a public health
 8 agency, or any other similar agency when:

9 (A) Such records consist of or contain audio or video recordings of the personal
 10 suffering of a crime victim, disaster victim, or other person in physical pain or distress;
 11 and

12 (B) Public dissemination of such records would cause emotional distress to the person
 13 whose suffering was so recorded or to the family of such person.

14 Records described in this paragraph shall be exempt from disclosure under this article by
 15 the law enforcement agency or other agency in possession; and if such records are used
 16 in evidence in any judicial or administrative proceeding, the tribunal may place such
 17 records under seal or otherwise prohibit their reproduction or distribution.

18 (2.2)(A) Except as otherwise provided by law, photographs, videos, or other
