## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Mr. James A. "Jimmy" Colquitt; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of Mr. James A. "Jimmy" Colquitt on February 15, 2010; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Colquitt was born on December 3, 1918, in Thomaston, Georgia, and had  
5 been a resident of Marietta, Georgia, since 1947; and
- 6 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United  
7 States Army as a second lieutenant, valiantly and courageously serving as a paratrooper in  
8 the Airborne Troops, protecting democracy and his fellow Americans; and
- 9 WHEREAS, during his service in the military, Mr. Colquitt was involved in the United  
10 States occupation of Berlin and was in charge of entertainment at the Potsdam Conference  
11 in 1945, serving as an aide to President Harry S. Truman and securing stars such as Bob  
12 Hope and Mickey Rooney; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Mr. Colquitt participated in five major campaigns, received one French and five  
14 United States decorations, and met Generalissimo Joseph Stalin, Prime Minister Winston  
15 Churchill, General Dwight Eisenhower, and General George Patton; and
- 16 WHEREAS, after returning from Germany, Mr. Colquitt was united in love and marriage to  
17 Betty Medford and went to work for her father's insurance business, a profession he excelled  
18 in, later purchasing the agency and running James A. Colquitt, Inc., for many years; and
- 19 WHEREAS, he studied business administration at the University of Georgia and was the  
20 consummate Bulldogs football fan, easily spotted at games in a red sports jacket and  
21 custom-made red and black alligator shoes; and

22 WHEREAS, a strong supporter of Bulldogs athletics, Mr. Colquitt worked tirelessly for 50  
23 years as a volunteer assistant to coaches, supporting the dreams of athletes, and served as  
24 trustee of the Student Education Fund in 1949; and

25 WHEREAS, he was the founder and former president of the Cobb County Bulldog Club,  
26 which has served as the model for many clubs located throughout the Southwest; and

27 WHEREAS, Mr. Colquitt was a long-time supporter of Woodward Academy, which was  
28 named Georgia Military Academy when he attended and which has recognized his assistance  
29 by naming the Colquitt Rifle Team, Colquitt Stadium, and the Colquitt Student Hall in his  
30 honor; and

31 WHEREAS, he was the founding member and president of The Atlanta Country Club in east  
32 Cobb and was instrumental in bringing the PGA Atlanta Golf Classic to the facility; and

33 WHEREAS, this respected community leader was active with numerous civic organizations  
34 in Marietta, including the Kiwanis Club, the Civil Service Board, Kennestone Hospital Guild,  
35 the Horace Orr American Legion Post, First National Bank of Cobb County, and the  
36 Georgian Club; and

37 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Mr. Colquitt will long be remembered for  
38 his love of Bulldogs athletics, family, and friendship, and this loyal community leader and  
39 friend will be missed by all; and

40 WHEREAS, Mr. Colquitt was a loving and devoted father of two daughters, Ginger and  
41 Cathy, and a proud grandfather, who, even though he projected a commanding presence,  
42 reassured all who knew him with his gentle and contagious smile.

43 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
44 join in honoring the life and memory of Mr. James A. "Jimmy" Colquitt and express their  
45 deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.

46 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed  
47 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to the family of Mr. James A. "Jimmy"  
48 Colquitt.
