## SENATE SUBSTITUTE TO HB 788

## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Article 1 of Chapter 11 of Title 4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,		
2	relating to animal protection, so as to prohibit the use of a gas chamber to euthanize dogs and		
3	cats; to provide for related matters; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws;		
4	and for other purposes.		
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:		
6	SECTION 1.		
7	Article 1 of Chapter 11 of Title 4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to		
8	animal protection, is amended by revising Code Section 4-11-5.1, relating to euthanasia of		
9	dogs and cats by animal shelters or facilities operated for collection of stray, neglected,		
10	abandoned, or unwanted animals, as follows:		
11	"4-11-5.1.		
12	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, the use of sodium		
13	pentobarbital or a derivative of it shall be the exclusive method for euthanasia of dogs and		
14	cats by animal shelters or other facilities which are operated for the collection and care of		
15	stray, neglected, abandoned, or unwanted animals. A lethal solution shall be used in the		
16	following order of preference:		
17	(1) Intravenous injection by hypodermic needle;		
18	(2) Intraperitoneal injection by hypodermic needle; or		
19	(3) Intracardial If the dog or cat is unconscious, intracardial injection by hypodermic		
20	needle.		
21	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this Code section.:		
22	(1) A chamber using commercially bottled carbon monoxide gas which was used on July		
23	1, 1990, for euthanasia of dogs and cats by any animal shelter or other facility may		
24	continue to be used for such purposes by such animal shelter or facility if such animal		
25	shelter or facility notifies the Commissioner of Agriculture, in writing, on or before		
26	August 1, 1990, that such a chamber was in use by such animal shelter or facility on July

- 1, 1990. However, a chamber which causes a change in body oxygen by means of altering
   atmospheric pressure or which is connected to an internal combustion engine and uses
   the engine exhaust for euthanasia purposes shall not be permitted under any
   circumstances; and
- 31 (2) Any any substance which is clinically proven to be as humane as sodium
  32 pentobarbital and which has been officially recognized as such by the American
  33 Veterinary Medical Association may be used in lieu of sodium pentobarbital to perform
  34 euthanasia on dogs and cats, but succinylcholine chloride, curare, curariform mixtures,
  35 or any substance which acts as a neuromuscular blocking agent may not be used on a dog
  36 or cat in lieu of sodium pentobarbital for euthanasia purposes.
- (c) In addition to the exceptions exception provided for in subsection (b) of this Code
  section, in cases of extraordinary circumstance where the dog or cat poses an extreme risk
  or danger to the veterinarian, physician, or lay person performing euthanasia, such person
  shall be allowed the use of any other substance or procedure that is humane to perform
  euthanasia on such dangerous dog or cat.
- (d) <u>Under no circumstance shall a chamber using commercially bottled carbon monoxide</u>
   gas or other lethal gas or a chamber which causes a change in body oxygen by means of
   altering atmospheric pressure or which is connected to an internal combustion engine and
   uses the engine exhaust for euthanasia purposes be permitted.
- 46 (d)(e) A dog or cat may be tranquilized with an approved and humane substance before
  47 euthanasia is performed.
- 48 (e)(f) Euthanasia shall be performed by a licensed veterinarian or physician or a lay person
   49 who is properly trained in the proper and humane use of a method of euthanasia. Such lay
   50 person shall perform euthanasia under supervision of a licensed veterinarian or physician.
   51 This shall not be construed so as to require that a veterinarian or physician be present at the
   52 time euthanasia is performed.
- 53 (f)(g) No dog or cat may be left unattended between the time euthanasia procedures are 54 first begun and the time death occurs, nor may its body be disposed of until death is 55 confirmed by a qualified person.
- 56 (g)(h) The supervising veterinarian or physician shall be subject to all record-keeping 57 requirements and inspection requirements of the State Board of Pharmacy pertaining to 58 sodium pentobarbital and other drugs authorized under subsection (b) of this Code section 59 and may limit the quantity of possession of sodium pentobarbital and other drugs 60 authorized to ensure compliance with the provisions of this Code section.
- (h) This Code section shall not apply to any animal shelter or other facility located in a
   county having a population of 25,000 or less according to the most recent United States
   decennial census."
