

## Senate Resolution 761

**ADOPTED SENATE**

## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the United States Congress to require the United States Census Bureau to provide a  
2 fair, accurate, and unbiased actual count of the population of the United States in the 2010  
3 decennial census; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, Article I, Section II of the United States Constitution mandates that a census of  
5 the United States population be conducted every ten years; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the next census is scheduled to be conducted in 2010; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the data from the census is used to distribute Congressional seats to states, to  
8 determine redistricting of legislative and other government bodies, to make decisions about  
9 what community services to provide, and to distribute \$300 billion in federal funds to local,  
10 state, and tribal governments each year; and
- 11 WHEREAS, an accurate count of the population is critical to the fair and equitable  
12 distribution of these seats, services, and funds; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the United States Census Bureau is vested with the authority to conduct the  
14 census; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Census Bureau has been a part of the United States Department of  
16 Commerce for many years and has reported to the Secretary of Commerce; and
- 17 WHEREAS, there has been much discussion of late regarding having the Census Bureau  
18 report to different officials in the federal government which has caused speculation that there  
19 will be an attempt to politicize the conduct of the census rather than having a neutral,  
20 nonpartisan count of the population; and

21 WHEREAS, there has also been much discussion of using alternative methods of counting  
22 as opposed to actual counts of the population such as statistical sampling and estimation of  
23 populations; and

24 WHEREAS, there is no substitute for an actual count of the population in the conduct of the  
25 census and there is no room for estimations and projections when so much is at stake based  
26 on the census data; and

27 WHEREAS, the United States Congress needs to ensure that the Census Bureau conduct a  
28 fair, accurate, and unbiased actual count of the United States population unmixed with any  
29 estimations or projections.

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body  
31 urge the United States Congress to ensure that the United States Census Bureau conducts a  
32 fair, accurate, and unbiased actual count of the population of the United States in the 2010  
33 decennial census and to ensure that the Census Bureau reports to the United States  
34 Department of Commerce and not to any other agency or office of the United States  
35 government.

36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed  
37 to transmit an appropriate copy of this resolution to each member of the Georgia  
38 congressional delegation.
