A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 50-13-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to procedures for adoption, amendment, or repeal of rules under the "Georgia Administrative Procedure Act," so as to change certain procedures; to change matters relative to legislative review; to provide for proposed rules to be made available to and made available by the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives; to provide for new and revised procedures relative to legislative override; to provide for other related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

Code Section 50-13-4 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to procedures for
 adoption, amendment, or repeal of rules under the "Georgia Administrative Procedure Act,"
 is amended by revising subsections (e) and (f) as follows:

- "(e)(1) The agency shall transmit the notice provided for in paragraph (1) of subsection
 (a) of this Code section to the legislative counsel. The notice shall be transmitted at least
 30 days prior to the date of the agency's intended action. Within three days after receipt
 of the notice, if possible, the legislative counsel shall furnish provide a copy of the notice
 to the presiding officers of each house with a copy of the notice, and the and to the
 Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 19 (2) The presiding officers shall assign the notice to the chairperson of the appropriate standing committee in each house for review and any member thereof of each house who 20 21 makes a standing written request. In the event a presiding officer is unavailable for the 22 purpose of making the assignment within the time limitations, the legislative counsel shall assign the notice to the chairperson of the appropriate standing committee. The 23 legislative counsel shall also transmit within the time limitations provided in this 24 25 subsection a notice of the assignment to the chairperson of the appropriate standing committee. Each standing committee of the Senate and the House of Representatives is 26

- granted all the rights provided for interested persons and governmental subdivisions in
 paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of this Code section.
- 29 (3) The Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall make
 30 the notice available for public inspection.
- (f)(1) In the event a standing committee to which a notice is assigned as provided in 31 32 paragraph (2) of subsection (e) of this Code section files an objection to a proposed rule 33 prior to its adoption and the agency adopts the proposed rule over the objection, the rule may be considered by the branch of the General Assembly whose committee objected to 34 35 its adoption by the introduction of a resolution for the purpose of overriding the rule at 36 any time within the first 30 days of the next regular session of the General Assembly. It shall be the duty of any agency which adopts a proposed rule over such objection so to 37 38 notify the presiding officers of the Senate and the House of Representatives, the chairmen 39 chairpersons of the Senate and House committees to which the rule was referred, and the legislative counsel within ten days after the adoption of the rule. In the event the 40 41 resolution is adopted by such branch of the General Assembly, it shall be immediately 42 transmitted to the other branch of the General Assembly. It shall be the duty of the 43 presiding officer of the other branch of the General Assembly to have the full 44 membership of such branch, within five days after the receipt of the resolution, to 45 consider vote for or against the resolution for the purpose of overriding the rule. In the event the resolution is adopted by two-thirds of the votes of each branch of the General 46 47 Assembly, the rule shall be void on the day after the adoption of the resolution by the second branch of the General Assembly. In the event the resolution is ratified by less 48 49 than two-thirds of the votes of either branch, the resolution shall be submitted to the Governor for his or her approval or veto. In the event of his or her veto, the rule shall 50 51 remain in effect. In the event of his or her approval, the rule shall be void on the day after 52 the date of his or her approval.
- (2) In the event each standing committee to which a notice is assigned as provided in 53 54 paragraph (2) of subsection (e) of this Code section files an objection to a proposed rule 55 prior to its adoption by a two-thirds' vote of the members of the committee who were 56 voting members on the tenth day of the current or most recent session, after having given public notice of the time, place, and purpose of such vote at least 48 hours in advance, as 57 58 well as the opportunity for members of the public, including the promulgating agency, 59 to have a reasonable time to comment on the proposed committee action at the hearing and the agency adopts the proposed rule over the objection, the effectiveness of such rule 60 shall be stayed until the next legislative session at which time the rule may be considered 61 by the General Assembly by the introduction of a resolution in either branch of the 62 General Assembly for the purpose of overriding the rule at any time within the first 30 63

64 days of the next regular session of the General Assembly. In the event the resolution is adopted by the branch of the General Assembly in which it was introduced, it shall be 65 immediately transmitted to the other branch of the General Assembly. It shall be the duty 66 of the presiding officer of the other branch of the General Assembly to have the full 67 membership of such branch, within five days after the receipt of the resolution, to 68 69 consider vote for or against the resolution for the purpose of overriding the rule. In the event the resolution is adopted by two-thirds of the votes of each branch of the General 70 71 Assembly, the rule shall be void on the day after the adoption of the resolution by the 72 second branch of the General Assembly. In the event the resolution is ratified by less 73 than two-thirds of the votes of either branch, the resolution shall be submitted to the 74 Governor for his or her approval or veto. In the event of his or her veto, the rule shall 75 remain in effect. In the event of his or her approval, the rule shall be void on the day after 76 the date of his or her approval. If after the thirtieth legislative day of the legislative 77 session of which the challenged rule was to be considered the General Assembly has not 78 considered an override of the challenged rule pursuant to this subsection, the rule shall 79 then immediately take effect.

(3)(A) In the event that an objection to a proposed rule is filed with signatures of at 80 81 least 91 members of the House of Representatives or of at least 29 members of the 82 Senate prior to its adoption, which members were voting members on the tenth day of the current or most recent session, after having given public notice of the filing of the 83 objection as well as the opportunity for members of the public, including the 84 85 promulgating agency, to have a reasonable time to comment on the proposed objection 86 at a hearing, the place, time, and purpose of which shall be included as part of the objection, and the agency adopts the proposed rule over the objection, the effectiveness 87 88 of such rule shall be stayed until the next legislative session at which time the rule may 89 be considered by the General Assembly by the introduction of a resolution in either branch of the General Assembly for the purpose of overriding the rule at any time 90 within the first 30 days of the next regular session of the General Assembly. In the 91 92 event the resolution is adopted by the branch of the General Assembly in which it was introduced, it shall be immediately transmitted to the other branch of the General 93 Assembly. It shall be the duty of the presiding officer of the other branch of the 94 General Assembly to have the full membership of such branch, within five days after 95 the receipt of the resolution, vote for or against the resolution. In the event the 96 resolution is adopted by two-thirds of the votes of each branch of the General 97 Assembly, the rule shall be void on the day after the adoption of the resolution by the 98 99 second branch of the General Assembly. In the event the resolution is ratified by fewer than two-thirds of the votes of either branch, the resolution shall be submitted to the 100

101	Governor for his or her approval or veto. In the event of his or her veto, the rule shall
102	remain in effect. In the event of his or her approval, the rule shall be void on the day
103	after the date of his or her approval. If after the thirtieth legislative day of the
104	legislative session of which the challenged rule was to be considered the General
105	Assembly has not considered an override of the challenged rule pursuant to this
106	subsection, the rule shall then immediately take effect.
107	(B) Each objection filed by at least 36 members of the House of Representatives or by
108	at least 11 members of the Senate shall be granted all the rights provided for interested
109	persons and governmental subdivisions in paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of this Code
