A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 1 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions relative to the General Assembly of Georgia, so as to require an oath or
- 3 affirmation for purposes of presenting certain evidence to a committee or subcommittee of
- 4 the General Assembly; to amend Article 4 of Chapter 10 of Title 16 of the Official Code of
- 5 Georgia Annotated, relating to perjury and related offenses, so as to change certain
- 6 provisions relating to false swearing; to provide a short title; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 7 for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

10 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Truth in Testimony Act."

SECTION 2.

- 12 Chapter 1 of Title 28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- provisions relative to the General Assembly of Georgia, is amended by adding a new Code
- 14 section to read as follows:
- 15 "<u>28-1-18.</u>
- The sanction of an oath or affirmation equivalent thereto may, at the discretion of the
- 17 <u>chairperson of any committee or subcommittee of the General Assembly, be made</u>
- 18 <u>necessary to the reception of any evidence by such committee or subcommittee in a</u>
- 19 meeting thereof. Any person whose speech or debate is privileged under Article III,
- 20 Section IV, Paragraph IX of the Constitution shall not be subject to this Code section."
- SECTION 3.
- 22 Article 4 of Chapter 10 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 23 perjury and related offenses, is amended by revising Code Section 16-10-71, relating to false
- 24 swearing, as follows:

- 25 "16-10-71.
- 26 (a)(1) A person to whom a lawful oath or affirmation has been administered or who
- executes a document knowing that it purports to be an acknowledgment of a lawful oath
- or affirmation commits the offense of false swearing when, in any matter or thing other
- 29 than a judicial proceeding, he <u>or she</u> knowingly and willfully makes a false statement.
- 30 (2) This subsection shall apply to persons subject to Code Section 28-1-18 only if the
- 31 <u>false statement concerns a material fact.</u>
- 32 (b) A person convicted of the offense of false swearing shall be punished by a fine of not
- more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years, or
- 34 both."

35 SECTION 4.

36 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
