

House Bill 64

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 31-10-15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 death certificate filings, so as to provide for the completion of the medical certification as to
3 the cause and circumstances of death during a certain period of time; to provide for penalties;
4 to provide that a coroner shall be authorized to complete and sign a medical certification as
5 to the cause and circumstances of death under certain circumstances; to provide for related
6 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Code Section 31-10-15 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to death
10 certificate filings, is amended by revising subsection (c) as follows:

11 "(c)(1) The medical certification as to the cause and circumstances of death shall be
12 completed, signed, and returned to the funeral director or person acting as such within 72
13 hours after death by the physician in charge of the patient's care for the illness or
14 condition which resulted in death, except when inquiry is required by Article 2 of Chapter
15 16 of Title 45, the 'Georgia Death Investigation Act.' In the absence of said physician or
16 with that physician's approval the certificate may be completed and signed by an
17 associate physician, the chief medical officer of the institution in which death occurred,
18 or the physician who performed an autopsy upon the decedent, provided that such
19 individual has access to the medical history of the case, views the deceased at or after
20 death, and death is due to natural causes. If, 90 days after a death, the physician in charge
21 of the patient's care for the illness or condition which resulted in death has failed to
22 complete, sign, and return the medical certification as to the cause and circumstances of
23 death to the funeral director or person acting as such, the funeral director or person acting
24 as such shall be authorized to report such physician to the Composite State Board of
25 Medical Examiners for discipline pursuant to Code Section 43-34-37.

26 (2) In the event that a physician authorized pursuant to paragraph (1) of this subsection
27 to complete a medical certification as to the cause and circumstances of death has not
28 completed such certification 90 days after the death, a coroner shall be authorized to
29 complete and sign the certification; provided, however, that he or she has reviewed the
30 medical history of the case and determines that the death is due to natural causes. A
31 coroner signing a certification pursuant to this paragraph shall retain the authority granted
32 pursuant to Code Section 45-16-27 to issue subpoenas to compel the production of
33 medical records, provided that such records are related to the death in question."

34 **SECTION 2.**

35 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
