- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Mr. Robert C. Stover; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the passing of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 3 and honorable military heroes with the passing of Mr. Robert C. Stover on December 25,
- 4 2008; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mr. Stover was born on February 15, 1928, in Berlin, Alabama, to Bessie
- 6 Smiley Stover and Mose Stover, Sr.; and
- 7 WHEREAS, this great Georgian was educated in the Dallas County Public School System
- 8 and graduated from Berlin Normal High School in 1946; and
- 9 WHERAS, Mr. Stover served his country with honor and distinction for 23 years in the
- 10 United States Army as a Sergeant First Class, serving two tours of duty in Korea, three tours
- in Germany, two tours in Vietnam, and one tour in Japan; and
- 12 WHEREAS, during Mr. Stover's military career he completed Ranger School at Ft. Benning,
- 13 Georgia, Chemical School at Ft. McClellan, Alabama, and Airborne School at Ft. Bragg,
- 14 North Carolina; and
- 15 WHEREAS, this devoted military officer received numerous awards and distinctions,
- 16 including two Purple Heart Medals, five Good Conduct Medals, a National Defense Service
- 17 Medal, a Vietnam Service Medal with four Bronze Stars, a Combat Infantry Badge, a Civil
- 18 Action Honor Medal, an Expert Marksman Badge, and a Master PSB; and
- 19 WHEREAS, after he retired from his military career, Mr. Stover worked as a machine
- 20 operator with W.C. Bradley-Charbroil Division, receiving many awards for his superior work
- 21 during his 25 years with the company, including Employee of the Month; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Stover was an active member of Greater Shady Grove Baptist Church,

- 23 where he served with devotion on the Deacon Ministry, and a lifetime member of the
- 24 NAACP, AMVETS, and DAV; and
- 25 WHEREAS, he was active in the Prince Hall Masonic family, holding many leadership
- 26 positions throughout the years, as well as a member of the Men's Progressive Club, where
- 27 he worked relentlessly to eradicate homelessness and racial inequality; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Mr. Stover's survivors include his five loving children, Reverend D. Albert
- 29 Turk, Clarence Bernard Stover, Reverend Daryl A. Stover, Robin Redmon, and Yolande
- 30 Stover, four grandchildren, and several other devoted relatives and loyal friends; and
- 31 WHEREAS, all who were privileged to know this distinguished Georgian join his family in
- 32 mourning his loss.
