A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 1 2 relating to state purchasing, so as to provide for a short title; to provide for legislative intent; 3 to provide for definitions; to provide for a selection preference in state contracting for 4 certified service-disabled veteran business enterprises; to provide for a certification procedure to be established by the Department of Administrative Services and the 5 Department of Veterans Service and reviewed biennially and updated as necessary; to 6 7 provide for requirements for application for, renewal of, and revocation of certification; to provide for duties of the departments; to require the Department of Veterans Service to report 8 9 the percentage of service-disabled veteran business enterprises using the statewide contracts 10 register; to amend Article 4 of Chapter 2 of Title 32 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department of Transportation exercising its power to contract, so 11 12 as to provide for a selection preference in department contracting for certified 13 service-disabled veteran business enterprises; to provide for related matters; to repeal 14 conflicting laws; to provide for an effective date.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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SECTION 1.

17 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Georgia Service-Disabled Veteran18 Business Enterprise Opportunity Act."

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23 <u>50-5-139.</u> 24 It is the intent of the General Assembly to rectify the economic disadvantage of 25 service-disabled veterans, who are statistically the least likely to be self-employed when 26 compared to the veteran population as a whole and who have made extraordinary sacrifices 27 on behalf of the nation, the state, and the public, by providing opportunities for 28 service-disabled veteran business enterprises. 29 50-5-139.1. 30 For the purpose of this part, the term: 31 (1) 'Certified service-disabled veteran business enterprise' means a business that has been 32 certified by the Department of Administrative Services to be a service-disabled veteran business enterprise as defined in paragraph (4) of this Code section. 33 34 (2) 'Department' means the Department of Administrative Services. 35 (3) 'Service-disabled veteran' means a veteran who is a permanent Georgia resident with 36 a service-connected disability of 10 percent or greater as determined by the United States 37 Department of Veterans Affairs or who has been terminated from military service by 38 reason of disability by the United States Department of Defense. 39 (4) 'Service-disabled veteran business enterprise' means an independently owned and 40 operated business that: 41 (A) Employs 200 or fewer permanent full-time employees; 42 (B) Together with its affiliates has a net worth of \$5 million or less or, if a sole 43 proprietorship, has a net worth of \$5 million or less including both personal and 44 business investments; 45 (C) Is organized to engage in commercial transactions; 46 (D) Is domiciled in this state; 47 (E) Is at least 51 percent owned by one or more service-disabled veterans; and 48 (F) The management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or 49 more service-disabled veterans or, for a service-disabled veteran with a permanent and 50 total disability, by the spouse or permanent caregiver of the veteran. 51 50-5-139.2. 52 (a) The department, when considering two or more bids, proposals, or replies for the procurement of commodities or contractual services, at least one of which is from a 53

In the case of a sole 82 proprietorship, the net worth includes personal and business investments. 83 (b) To maintain certification, a service-disabled veteran business enterprise shall renew 84 its certification biennially. 85 (c) A certified service-disabled veteran business enterprise must notify the department 86 within 30 business days after any event that may significantly affect the certification of the 87 business, including, but not limited to, a change in ownership or change in management 88 and daily business operations. 89 (d) The certification of a service-disabled veteran business enterprise shall be revoked for 90 12 months if the department determines that the business enterprise violated subsection (d)
