A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 6 of Title 9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
extraordinary writs, so as to provide that no writ of mandamus or writ of prohibition to
compel the removal of a superior court judge shall issue where no motion to recuse has been
filed in a timely manner or where a motion to recuse has been denied; to repeal conflicting
laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
SECTION 1.

8 Chapter 6 of Title 9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to extraordinary
9 writs, is amended by revising Code Section 9-6-20, relating to when mandamus may issue,
10 as follows:

11 ″9-6-20.

12 All official duties should be faithfully performed;, and whenever, from any cause, a defect

13 of legal justice would ensue from a failure to perform or from improper performance, the

14 writ of mandamus may issue to compel a due performance, if there is no other specific

15 legal remedy for the legal rights; provided, however, that no writ of mandamus to compel

16 the removal of a superior court judge shall issue where no motion to recuse has been filed

17 in a timely manner or where a motion to recuse has been denied."

SECTION 2.

19 Said chapter is further amended by revising Code Section 9-6-40, relating to prohibition20 counterpart of mandamus, as follows:

21 ″9-6-40.

22 The writ of prohibition is the counterpart of mandamus, to restrain subordinate courts and

23 inferior judicial tribunals from exceeding their jurisdiction, where no other legal remedy

- or relief is given. The granting or refusal thereof is governed by the same principles of
- 25 right, necessity, and justice as apply to mandamus<u>; provided, however, that no writ of</u>

- 26 prohibition to compel the removal of a superior court judge shall issue where no motion
- 27 to recuse has been filed in a timely manner or where a motion to recuse has been denied."
- 28 **SECTION 3.**
- 29 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
