The House Committee on Game, Fish and Parks offers the following substitute to HB 326:

# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to game and fish, so 2 as to change certain provisions relating to effective periods of hunting, fishing, and trapping 3 licenses generally; to change certain provisions relating to archery and primitive weapons 4 hunting license, all weapons hunting license, sportsman license, license card carrier 5 requirement, and creation of lifetime sportsman's license; to change certain provisions relating to required hunter education courses; to change certain provisions relating to trout 6 7 license, official Georgia waterfowl license, big game license, and alligator hunting license; 8 to change certain provisions relating to powers of department as to making and entering into 9 agreements relating to hunting license reciprocity; to change certain provisions relating to 10 falconry permits, duties, permitted acts, and prohibitions pertaining to permit holders; to 11 change certain provisions relating to field and retriever trials, permits, and hunting licenses; 12 to change certain provisions relating to game and fish license, permit, tag, and stamp fees; 13 to change certain provisions relating to laws applicable to shooting preserves and 14 requirements as to hunting licenses; to amend an Act to amend Title 27 of the Official Code 15 of Georgia Annotated, approved March 10, 1992 (Ga. L. 1992, page 470), so as to delete 16 certain provisions relating to reduction of game and fish license, permit, tag, and stamp fees; 17 to amend an Act to amend Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, approved June 18 3, 2003 (Ga. L. 2003, page 654), so as to repeal and delete certain provisions relating to game 19 and fish license, permit, tag, and stamp fees and an effective date; to amend an Act to amend 20 Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, approved May 21 5, 2005 (Ga. L. 2005, page 517), so as to repeal and delete certain provisions relating to game 22 and fish license, permit, tag, and stamp fees and an effective date; to provide for an effective 23 date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

25 **SECTION 1.** 26 Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to game and fish, is amended by 27 revising Code Section 27-2-3, relating to effective periods of hunting, fishing, and trapping 28 licenses generally, as follows: 29 "27-2-3. 30 (a) Except as otherwise specifically provided, all hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses, 31 including without limitation commercial fishing and commercial fishing boat licenses issued pursuant to Code Section 27-2-8, shall be effective from April 1 to March 31 of 32 33 the following year; except that all annual, two-year, or other multi-year hunting, fishing, 34 and hunting and fishing combination licenses issued pursuant to paragraphs (1) through 35 (4) of Code Section 27-2-23 shall be effective for 12 months from through the applicable 36 one-, two-, or multi-year anniversary of the date of issuance. 37 (b) Multi-year licenses valid for any desired number of years may be purchased through a single transaction for licenses listed in paragraphs (1) through (4) of Code Section 38 39 27-2-23. The fee for any such multi-year license shall be equivalent to the lowest cost 40 combination of annual or two-year licenses necessary to form the desired multi-year license period. No multi-year license shall be valid at the time of hunting or fishing 41

42 <u>unless the licensee is a resident of this state at such time.</u>"

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#### **SECTION 2.**

44 Said title is further amended by revising subsection (a) of Code Section 27-2-3.1, relating to

45 archery and primitive weapons hunting license, all weapons hunting license, sportsman
46 license, license card carrier requirement, and creation of lifetime sportsman's license, as
47 follows:

- 48 "(a) Persons hunting during any archery season or primitive weapons season must purchase
- 49 a primitive weapons license, unless otherwise provided by this title <u>Reserved</u>."

Said title is further amended by revising subsection (e) of Code Section 27-2-5, relating to
required hunter education courses, as follows:

**SECTION 3.** 

53 "(e) Any person applying for a season nonresident hunting an annual nonresident 54 <u>hunting/fishing license</u> may provide a certificate of completion or such other evidence of 55 completion the department deems acceptable of the official hunter education or hunter 56 safety course of such person's state of residence if that course shall have been approved by 57 the department. Those persons applying for a hunting license other than a season hunting 58 license shall not be required to exhibit such a certificate or to complete a hunter education 59 course in order to obtain the license."

#### **SECTION 4.**

Said title is further amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 27-2-6, relating to
trout license, official Georgia waterfowl license, big game license, and alligator hunting
license, as follows:

64 "(b) It shall be unlawful for any person who has attained the age of 16 years to hunt or 65 possess big game unless such person has in his or her possession a big game license in 66 addition to the required hunting license; provided, however, that all nonresidents, 67 regardless of age, must possess a nonresident hunting hunting/fishing license along with 68 any harvest records required by law or regulation to hunt big game in this state."

#### **SECTION 5.**

70 Said title is further amended by revising subsections (a) and (c) of Code Section 27-2-7,

relating to powers of department as to making and entering into agreements relating tohunting license reciprocity, as follows:

73 "(a) The department is authorized to make and enter into agreements, from time to time, 74 with the proper authorities of the States of Alabama, Florida, South Carolina, North 75 Carolina, and Tennessee whereby a citizen of the State of Georgia who owns farm lands 76 in such adjoining states may purchase a resident hunting license in the state in which his 77 land is situated which will permit said Georgia citizen to hunt on his own land in the 78 adjoining state without purchasing a nonresident hunting license in that state. The 79 department is authorized to reciprocate this courtesy and issue a resident hunting license 80 in Georgia to citizens of such adjoining states who own farm lands in Georgia, permitting 81 such citizens to hunt on their own land in Georgia without purchasing a nonresident 82 hunting hunting/fishing license."

83 "(c) The department is authorized to make and enter into agreements, from time to time, 84 with the proper authorities of the States of Alabama, Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee, regarding nonresident hunting hunting/fishing license fees, 85 86 seasons, and bag limits; provided, however, that such seasons and bag limits for 87 nonresident hunters shall not be less restrictive than those which control Georgia residents; 88 and provided, further, that nonresident license fees in Georgia shall not be less than the 89 amount established in Code Section 27-2-23 for a small game hunting license and for a big 90 game hunting license."

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#### **SECTION 6.**

92 Said title is further amended by revising subsections (a) and (w) of Code Section 27-2-17,

relating to falconry permits, duties, permitted acts, and prohibitions pertaining to permitholders, as follows:

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95 "(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to trap, take, transport, or possess raptors for 96 falconry purposes unless the person first procures, in addition to a valid hunting license, 97 a valid falconry permit as provided in Code Section 27-2-23, provided that it shall not be 98 unlawful for a nonresident to transport or possess raptors in this state for falconry purposes 99 if the person has a nonresident hunting hunting/fishing license, as provided in Code Section 100 27-2-23, and a falconry license or permit from the state of residence of the person, which

101 state meets federal falconry standards."

102 "(w) It shall be lawful for a nonresident to take or attempt to take raptors from the wild in

103 this state if the nonresident has a valid general or master level falconry permit from such

104 person's state of residence and a valid Georgia nonresident hunting hunting/fishing license

and if such person's state of residence provides the same privileges to residents of Georgia."

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### **SECTION 7.**

Said title is further amended by revising subsection (c) of Code Section 27-2-21, relating tofield and retriever trials, permits, and hunting licenses, as follows:

109 "(c) All persons participating in a field or retriever trial will be required to have an

110 appropriate resident or nonresident hunting license or nonresident hunting/fishing license

111 unless the field or retriever trial is recognized by a nationally registered field trialing

112 organization or unless the field or retriever trial is conducted by a local field trialing

113 organization based in the State of Georgia which is recognized by the department as being

114 qualified to conduct such trial."

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### **SECTION 8.**

116 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-2-23, relating to game and fish

117 license, permit, tag, and stamp fees, as follows:

118 *"*27-2-23.

daily, seasonal, or annual use permits, <u>or licenses, or stamps; a fee of \$38.00 for resident</u>
two-year use permits; or a fee not to exceed \$73.00 for nonresident annual use permits
<u>or licenses</u> to hunt and fish on or otherwise use specially designated streams, lakes, <u>public</u>
<u>fishing areas</u>, or wildlife management areas or a fee not to exceed \$73.00 for nonresident
<u>permits</u>, licenses, or stamps issued under this paragraph.

212 (10) The fees established in subparagraphs (1)(A) through (1)(F), (2)(A), (2)(B), (2)(E),

213 (3)(A), (3)(B), (4)(A), (4)(B), (4)(C), (4)(D), (4)(E), and (4)(G) of this Code section shall

- 214 <u>be reduced by \$2.75 for each renewal transaction made before the expiration date of the</u>
- 215 then current license or tag. For purposes of this paragraph, the term 'renewal transaction'
- 216 means the renewal of one or more licenses by a licensee during a single telephone call,
- 217 Internet session, or on-site visit to a store."

## **SECTION 9.**

219 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 27-3-114, relating to laws and 220 regulations applicable to shooting preserves and requirements as to hunting licenses, as 221 follows:

222 "27-3-114.

223 Except as otherwise specifically provided, all wildlife laws and regulations shall be in full 224 force and effect on shooting preserves licensed pursuant to this article. Specifically, hunting licenses shall be required of all persons hunting on such preserves; provided, 225 however, that it shall be lawful for any resident or nonresident to hunt pen raised game 226 227 birds on such a preserve with a nonresident shooting preserve hunting license as provided in Code Section 27-2-23; and provided, further, that it shall be lawful for any person to 228 229 hunt pen raised game birds without a hunting license on a shooting preserve which 230 possesses a valid blanket shooting preserve license as provided in Code Section 27-2-23."

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231	SECTION 10.

242	"(3) Section 7B of this Act shall become effective on March 12, 2012."
243	SECTION 12.
244	An Act to amend Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 27 of the Official Code of Georgia
245	Annotated, approved May 5, 2005 (Ga. L. 2005, p. 517), is amended by repealing Section
246	2 and deleting the exception at the end of Section 3 which reads as follows:
247	"; except that Section 2 of this Act shall become effective on March 31, 2012."

249	This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
