A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to organization and members of the Public Service Commission, so as to provide that
- 3 members of the Public Service Commission shall represent the entire state and be elected
- 4 state wide; to change the term and manner of the election of the chairperson of the
- 5 commission; to provide for the election of other officers; to provide for the establishment of
- rules by the commission as to quorum, attendance, and other matters; to provide for an 6
- 7 effective date; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 8 purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

10 **SECTION 1.**

- 11 Article 1 of Chapter 2 of Title 46 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 12 organization and members of the Public Service Commission, is amended by revising Code
- 13 Section 46-2-1, relating to election of Commissioners and terms of office, as follows:
- 14 "46-2-1.
- 15 (a) The Georgia Public Service Commission shall consist of five members to be elected
- 16 as provided in this Code section. The members in office on January 1, 2000 2010, and any
- 17 member appointed or elected to fill a vacancy in such membership prior to the expiration
- 18 of a term of office shall continue to serve out their respective terms of office. As terms of
- 19 office expire, new members elected to the commission shall be required to be residents of
- 20 one of five Public Service Commission Districts as hereafter provided, but each this state
- and may reside anywhere within this state. Each member of the commission shall be 22 elected state wide by the qualified voters of this state who are entitled to vote for members
- 23 of the General Assembly. Except as otherwise provided in this Code section, the election
- 24 shall be held under the same rules and regulations as apply to the election of Governor. The
- Commissioners, who shall give their entire time to the duties of their offices, shall be 25
- 26 elected at the general election next preceding the expiration of the terms of office of the

27 respective incumbents. Their terms of office shall be six years and shall expire on

- December 31.
- 29 (b) In order to be elected as a member of the commission from a Public Service
- 30 Commission District, a person must have resided in that district this state for at least 12
- 31 months prior to election thereto. A person elected as a member of the commission from a
- 32 Public Service Commission District by the voters of Georgia must continue to reside in that
- 33 district this state during the person's term of office or that office shall thereupon become
- 34 vacant.
- 35 (c) For the purpose of electing the members of the Public Service Commission, the state
- 36 shall be divided into five Public Service Commission Districts described as follows:

352	(d)(c) The first members of the commission elected under this Code section shall be
353	elected thereto on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2000, from
354	2012, to succeed the members from former Public Service Commission Districts 3 and 5

shall take office on the first day of January immediately following that election, and shall serve for terms of office of six years and until the election and qualification of their respective successors. Those members of the commission elected thereto on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2002, from 2014, to succeed the members from Public Service Commission Districts 1 and 4 shall take office on the first day of January immediately following that election and shall serve for terms of office of six years and until the election and qualification of their respective successors. The member of the commission elected thereto on the Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2004, from 2010, to succeed the member from Public Service Commission District 2 shall take office on the first day of January immediately following that election and shall serve for a term of office of six years and until the election and qualification of his or her respective successor. All future successors to members of the commission whose terms of office are to expire shall be elected at the state-wide general election immediately preceding the expiration of such terms, shall take office on the first day of January immediately following that election, and shall serve for terms of office of six years.

(e) For purposes of this Code section:

(1) The terms 'Tract' and 'BG' (Block Group) shall mean and describe the same geographical boundaries as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia. The separate numeric designations in a Tract description which are underneath a 'BG' heading shall mean and describe individual Blocks within a Block Group as provided in the report of the Bureau of the Census for the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in the description of any Public Service Commission District, whenever the description of any Public Service Commission District refers to a named city, it shall mean the geographical boundaries of that city as shown on the census maps for the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia.

(3) Any part of the State of Georgia which is not included in any Public Service Commission District described in subsection (c) of this Code section shall be included within that district contiguous to such part which contains the least population according to the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia.

(4) Any part of the State of Georgia which is described in subsection (c) of this Code section as being included in a particular Public Service Commission District shall nevertheless not be included within such Public Service Commission District if such part is not contiguous to such Public Service Commission District. Such noncontiguous part shall instead be included within that Public Service Commission District contiguous to such part which contains the least population according to the United States decennial census of 2000 for the State of Georgia."

392 **SECTION 2.**

393 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 46-2-5, relating to chairman of the commission and selection, as follows:

395 "46-2-5.

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- (a) There shall be a chairman chairperson of the commission. The chairperson shall be selected by a simple majority of the members of the commission. The initial chairperson selected under this Code section shall take office within 15 days after January 1, 2010, and shall serve for a term of office as chairperson until January 1, 2013, or until his or her term as a member of the commission shall expire, whichever is shorter. Each subsequent chairperson shall serve for a three-year term of office as chairperson or until his or her term as a member of the commission shall expire, whichever is shorter. Any two members of the commission may call for an election of a chairperson at any time prior to the end of the three-year term of a chairperson; provided, however, such elections shall not be held more than once per calendar year, except in the case of a vacancy by the chairperson; and provided, further, any chairperson so elected shall serve for a three-year term of office as chairperson or until his or her term as a member of the commission shall expire, whichever is shorter. The chairman shall be selected on an annual basis. The initial chairman selected under this Code section shall take office within 15 days after April 20, 1992, and shall serve for a term of office as chairman expiring January 1, 1993. Thereafter a new chairman shall take office within 15 days after the first day of January in 1993 and each subsequent year; and each such chairman shall serve for a one-year term of office as chairman.
- (b) The chairman shall be selected by the members of the commission according to the following rules; and for purposes of these rules, seniority on the commission shall be determined according to the longest period of continuous unbroken service:
- (1) A member of the commission with less than one year of continuous unbroken service on the commission shall not be eligible to take office as chairman;
 - (2) A member of the commission who has previously served as chairman shall not be eligible to serve again as chairman until each other eligible member (i.e., each other member with more than one year of continuous service on the commission) has served as chairman or has deferred service as chairman;
 - (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection, the most senior member of the commission who is eligible to serve as chairman shall be selected to the office of chairman; provided, however, that such member may elect to defer service as chairman for a period of one year, at the conclusion of which year such member shall resume his place at the head of the order of rotation for the chairmanship; and

427	(4) If in any year the foregoing rules fail to provide for a chairman because two or more
428	members have equal seniority, then the member to serve as chairman shall be selected by
429	lot.
430	(c) Anything in subsection (b) of this Code section to the contrary notwithstanding, the
431	members of the commission may by unanimous vote of the members select any member
432	as chairman for any given year for a term of office as chairman as specified in
433	subsection (a) of this Code section.
434	(d)(b) The chairman chairperson shall give his or her entire time to the duties of his the
435	office.
436	(c) The members of the commission may elect such other officers as they deem advisable
437	and shall establish such quorum, attendance, and other rules as they deem necessary for the
438	most efficient operation of the commission. The commission may meet at such times and
439	places within this state as the commission deems necessary."

SECTION 3.

This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2010.

SECTION 4.

443 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
