## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Claiming sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States
- 2 over certain powers and serving notice to the federal government to cease and desist certain
- 3 mandates; and for other purposes.
- 4 WHEREAS, the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States reads as follows:
- 5 "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to
- 6 the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people."; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the Tenth Amendment defines the total scope of federal power as being that
- 8 specifically granted by the Constitution of the United States and no more; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the scope of power defined by the Tenth Amendment means that the federal
- 10 government was created by the states specifically to be an agent of the states; and
- 11 WHEREAS, today, in 2009, the states are demonstrably treated as agents of the federal
- 12 government; and
- 13 WHEREAS, many federal mandates are directly in violation of the Tenth Amendment to the
- 14 Constitution of the United States; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has ruled in New York v. United States, 112
- 16 S. Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply commandeer the legislative and regulatory
- 17 processes of the states; and
- 18 WHEREAS, a number of proposals from previous administrations and some now pending
- 19 from the present administration and from Congress may further violate the Constitution of
- 20 the United States.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY of

- 22 GEORGIA, that the State of Georgia hereby claims sovereignty under the Tenth Amendment
- 23 to the Constitution of the United States over all powers not otherwise enumerated and
- 24 granted to the federal government by the Constitution of the United States.
- 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED this serves as notice and demand to the federal government,
- as our agent, to cease and desist, effective immediately, mandates that are beyond the scope
- 27 of these constitutionally delegated powers.
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a
- 29 copy of this resolution to the President of the United States, the President of the United States
- 30 Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Speaker of the House
- 31 and the President of the Senate of each state's legislature of the United States of America, and
- 32 each member of the Georgia Congressional Delegation.
