A RESOLUTION

1 Urging the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia and Georgia's private

2 colleges and universities to increase teacher production to meet the state's need for K-12

3 teachers; and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, the Joint Study Committee on Teacher Training and Certification found that
Georgia faces a significant teacher shortage, particularly in high-need fields such as math,
science, and special education, and that Georgia also faces a 9 percent attrition rate for
teachers each year; and

8 WHEREAS, the study committee learned that the public and private colleges and universities 9 in this state do not produce enough teachers to meet the needs of the state's public school 10 systems and that, because of this shortage, Georgia must rely on recruiting teachers from 11 outside of the state; and

WHEREAS, the data show that teachers prepared by out-of-state colleges and universities
have a lower retention rate than teachers prepared by Georgia colleges and universities; and

WHEREAS, to address this shortfall, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia has established the "20,000 by 2020" initiative to meet 80 percent of the state's need for teachers within the next 12 years, a significant increase from the current level of 30 percent; and

WHEREAS, the study committee recommended that private colleges and universities, which currently produce approximately 20 percent of all new teachers prepared by Georgia institutions of higher learning, give strong consideration to increasing the number of teacher preparation programs offered, particularly in math, science, and special education; and

- WHEREAS, the study committee also recommended adding teacher preparation programs at additional institutions, enhancing the current teacher preparation process, and implementing innovative initiatives such as the collaborative effort between five institutions of the University System of Georgia, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, and the Professional Standards Commission to provide online Master of Arts in Teaching programs beginning in January, 2009; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the study committee also recommended that the public and private colleges and
- 29 universities address concerns about five-year bachelor's level teacher preparation programs
- 30 in light of current teacher shortages and the University System of Georgia's 2020 initiative.
- 31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 32 GEORGIA that this body urges the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia
- 33 and Georgia's private colleges and universities to increase teacher production to meet the
- 34 state's need for K-12 teachers.
