

Senate Bill 245

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
2 relating to general provisions regarding insurance generally, so as to require that a health
3 benefit plan that provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy shall provide coverage for
4 orally administered cancer medication; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting
5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Article 1 of Chapter 24 of Title 33 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
9 general provisions regarding insurance generally, is amended by adding a new Code section
10 to read as follows:

11 "33-24-56.5.

12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'health benefit policy' means any individual or
13 group plan, policy, or contract for health care services issued, delivered, issued for
14 delivery, executed, or renewed by an insurer in this state on or after July 1, 2002, including,
15 but not limited to, those contracts executed by the Department of Community Health
16 pursuant to paragraph (1) of subsection (f) of Code Section 31-5A-4. The term 'health
17 benefit policy' does not include the following limited benefit insurance policies: accident
18 only, CHAMPUS supplement, dental, disability income, fixed indemnity, long-term care,
19 medicare supplement, specified disease, vision, and nonrenewable individual policies
20 written for a period of less than six months.

21 (b) A health benefit plan that provides coverage for cancer chemotherapy treatment shall
22 provide coverage for a prescribed, orally administered anticancer medication used to kill
23 or slow the growth of cancerous cells on a basis no less favorable than intravenously
24 administered or injected cancer medications that are covered as medical benefits."

SECTION 2.

26 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
