ADOPTED SENATE

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging educational agencies, associations, boards, and commissions involved in the
- 2 accreditation process for school systems in grades kindergarten through 12 to adopt policies
- 3 and procedures that permit a fair opportunity for school systems to submit necessary
- 4 documentation; and for other purposes.
- 5 WHEREAS, the loss of a school system's accreditation is a serious issue with long-ranging
- 6 impact on a community and families; and
- 7 WHEREAS, it is a gross injustice for Georgia's children to be punished by the loss of
- 8 accreditation due to the failings or mismanagement by boards or agencies that are entrusted
- 9 with the responsibility of educating Georgia students; and
- 10 WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon all stakeholders in the accreditation process to implement
- 11 a system of review that strives for fairness and accurate information.
- 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that this body does hereby
- 13 urge educational agencies, associations, boards, and commissions to make their first priority
- 14 the education and well-being of the students of a school system.
- 15 IT IS FURTHER URGED that educational agencies, associations, boards, and commissions
- 16 involved in the accreditation process adopt a policy and practice whereby school systems
- 17 subject to losing accreditation shall be given every reasonable opportunity to meet the
- 18 standards and requirements of such accrediting entity, and that such policy and practice
- 19 include, at a minimum, the following procedures:
- 20 (1) Prior to the deadline for any report required as a response to a need for improvement
- or correction, a school or school system shall be permitted to make an early submission
- of the documentation and information that addresses the sections or items in need of
- 23 improvement or correction;

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24 (2) The accrediting entity shall accept such early submission of documentation as a provisional submission rather than a final submission;

- 26 (3) Following the provisional submission of the documentation, the accrediting entity 27 shall respond in writing as to whether the documentation is judged to pass or fail and
- shall provide a description of the deficiencies in the provisional submission; and
- 29 (4) The accrediting entity shall provide the school or school system at least one
- 30 opportunity to correct or improve the documentation provided in the provisional
- 31 submission prior to the final deadline for submission.
- 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is authorized and directed
- 33 to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the State Board of Education, the Southern
- 34 Association of Colleges and Schools, and the Georgia Accrediting Commission.
