

## House Resolution 642

## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the House Study Committee on Regional Educational Service Agencies; and for  
2 other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, a state-wide network of regional educational service agencies has been  
4 established by the State Board of Education pursuant to state law for the purposes of  
5 providing shared services designed to improve the effectiveness of educational programs and  
6 services to local school systems, providing instructional programs directly to selected public  
7 school students in the state, and providing Georgia Learning Resources System services; and

8 WHEREAS, under current law, all local school systems, Technical College System of  
9 Georgia facilities and institutions, and University System of Georgia facilities and  
10 institutions that are located in each designated geographical area are required to be members  
11 of the appropriate regional educational service agency; and

12 WHEREAS, the shared services that each regional educational service agency is required to  
13 provide to local school systems includes:

- 14 (1) Identifying or conducting research related to educational improvements and in  
15 planning for the implementation of such improvements;
- 16 (2) Developing and implementing staff development programs with an emphasis on  
17 improving student achievement and school accountability;
- 18 (3) Developing and implementing curricula and instruction of the highest quality possible,  
19 including implementing the uniformly sequenced core curriculum adopted by the state  
20 board;
- 21 (4) Developing and implementing academic assessment and evaluation programs;
- 22 (5) Identifying and utilizing electronic technology, including computers, in an effort to  
23 improve the quality of classroom instruction as well as classroom, school, and school  
24 system management;
- 25 (6) Developing programs, resource materials, and staff development services relating to  
26 instruction on alcohol and drug abuse; and

27 (7) Assistance in the development and implementation of a state-wide mentoring program;  
28 and

29 WHEREAS, regional educational service agencies are funded through appropriations by the  
30 General Assembly and payments from local school systems; and

31 WHEREAS, in these economic times, it is prudent to consider and study the continued  
32 mandatory nature of regional educational service agencies and the required membership by  
33 local school systems and public postsecondary institutions as well as the continued funding  
34 by the state of these regional educational service agencies.

35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
36 there is created the House Study Committee on Regional Educational Service Agencies to  
37 be composed of five members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the  
38 Speaker of the House of Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the  
39 committee as chairperson of the committee. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the  
40 committee.

41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of the above  
42 issues and recommend any actions or legislation that the committee deems necessary or  
43 appropriate. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as  
44 it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers,  
45 perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution. The  
46 members of the committee shall receive the allowances authorized for legislative members  
47 of interim legislative committees but shall receive the same for not more than five days  
48 unless additional days are authorized. The funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this  
49 resolution shall come from the funds appropriated to the House of Representatives. In the  
50 event that the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations with  
51 suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before December  
52 31, 2009. The committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2009.
