A RESOLUTION

Creating the Senate Study Committee on Autism; and for other purposes. 1

- 2 WHEREAS, the health of its citizens is of primary importance to the State of Georgia; and
- 3 WHEREAS, access to health care services and availability and affordability of health
- 4 insurance have a direct impact on the lives and well-being of the residents of this state; and
- 5 WHEREAS, it would be beneficial to study autism insurance coverage and to identify its
- shortcomings and gaps with regard to providing autism services to all Georgians and to study 6
- 7 the optimum means to address these issues.

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that there is created the Senate 8
- 9 Study Committee on Autism to be composed of five members of the Senate to be appointed
- 10 by the Lieutenant Governor. The Lieutenant Governor shall designate a chairperson from
- 11 among the appointees. The committee shall meet at the call of the chairperson.
- 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall undertake a study of issues
- 13 surrounding the availability and affordability of health care insurance covering autism and
- access to health care services. The committee may conduct such meetings at such places and 14
- 15 at such times as it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and
- effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this 16
- resolution. The members of the committee shall receive the allowances authorized for 17
- legislative members of interim legislative committees from the funds appropriated to the 18
- Senate but shall receive the same for not more than five days unless additional days are authorized. In the event the committee makes a report of its findings and recommendations, 20
- with suggestions for proposed legislation, if any, such report shall be made on or before 21
- 22 December 31, 2009. The committee shall stand abolished on December 31, 2009.
