## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Robbie Susan Moore; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 and community servants with the passing of Mrs. Robbie Susan Moore on July 26, 2008; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mrs. Moore was a native of Georgia and a resident of Gwinnett County since  
5 the early 1960's; and
- 6 WHEREAS, she founded the United Ebony Society in Gwinnett County to promote dialogue  
7 regarding education, voter registration, and race relations; and
- 8 WHEREAS, this godly woman was a dedicated wife and mother who devoted her time and  
9 talents to bringing people of all races together in common service to their fellow citizens; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mrs. Moore faithfully organized the King Day Celebration in Gwinnett County  
11 for more than 20 years and worked tirelessly until King Day was recognized as an official  
12 holiday by Gwinnett County, the Gwinnett County School District, and every municipality  
13 within Gwinnett County; and
- 14 WHEREAS, this dedicated woman faithfully served the citizens of Gwinnett County as a  
15 bailiff in the Gwinnett County courts, as the organizer of political forums, as a deputy voter  
16 registrar and poll manager, and as a conscientious community activist.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
18 the members of this body hereby join in honoring the life and memory of Mrs. Robbie Susan  
19 Moore and in expressing their appreciation for her special and unique gift of bringing people  
20 together and for recognizing the positive contributions of all mankind.
