A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 14 of Chapter 1 of Title 10 and Code Section 16-8-12 of the Official Code
- 2 of Georgia Annotated, relating to secondary metals recyclers and penalties for certain theft
- 3 crimes, respectively, so as to provide for the regulation of theft of regulated metal property;
- 4 to change a definition; to change provisions relating to transaction records; to regulate
- 5 payments to persons selling certain property to secondary metals recyclers; to revise
- 6 provisions relating to theft of regulated metal property; to provide for related matters; to
- 7 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Article 14 of Chapter 1 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- secondary metals recyclers, is amended by revising paragraph (5) of Code Section 10-1-350,
- 12 relating to definitions, as follows:
- 13 "(5) 'Personal identification card' means a <u>current and unexpired</u> driver's license or
- identification card issued by the Department of Driver Services or a similar card issued
- by another state, a military identification card, a passport, or an appropriate work
- authorization issued by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services of the Department
- of Homeland Security, which shall contain the individual's name, address, and
- 18 <u>photograph</u>."
- 19 SECTION 2.
- 20 Said article is further amended by revising paragraph (6) of subsection (a) of Code Section
- 21 10-1-351, relating to record of transactions, and adding a new subsection (c) to read as
- 22 follows:
- 23 "(6) The name and address A photocopy of a valid personal identification card of the
- person delivering the regulated metal property to the secondary metals recycler;"

"(c) When the metal being purchased is a motor vehicle, the person offering to sell the
 motor vehicle to a secondary metals recycler shall either provide the title to such motor
 vehicle or fully execute a cancellation of certificate of title for scrap vehicles form as

- 28 promulgated by the Department of Revenue, Motor Vehicle Division, designated as
- 29 MV-1SP, in accordance with Code Section 40-3-36. The secondary metals recycler shall
- 30 <u>forward the title or MV-1SP form to the Department of Revenue within 72 hours of receipt</u>
- 31 <u>of the title or form.</u>"
- 32 SECTION 3.
- 33 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 34 "10-1-352.1.
- 35 (a) As used in this Code section, the terms:
- 36 (1) 'Aluminum property' means aluminum forms designed to shape concrete.
- 37 (2) 'Copper property' means any copper wire, copper tubing, copper pipe, or any item
- 38 <u>composed completely of copper.</u>
- 39 (b) A secondary metals recycler may pay by check or by cash for any copper property,
- 40 <u>catalytic converter, or aluminum property as follows:</u>
- 41 (1) Cash payments shall occur no earlier than 24 hours after the copper property,
- 42 <u>catalytic converter, or aluminum property is provided to the secondary metals recycler;</u>
- 43 <u>and</u>
- 44 (2) Checks shall be payable only to the person named who was recorded as delivering
- 45 <u>the copper property, catalytic converter, or aluminum property to the secondary metals</u>
- 46 <u>recycler</u>; provided, however, that if such person is delivering the copper property,
- 47 <u>catalytic converter, or aluminum property on behalf of a governmental entity or a</u>
- 48 nonprofit or for profit business, the check may be payable to such business or entity and
- 49 <u>may also be transmitted to such business or entity.</u>
- 50 (c) The provisions of this Code section shall not apply to any transaction between business
- 51 entities."
- 52 SECTION 4.
- 53 Code Section 16-8-12 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to penalties for
- violation of Code Sections 16-8-2 through 16-8-9, is amended by revising paragraph (9) of
- subsection (a) as follows:
- 56 "(9) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection, if the property
- of the theft was ferrous metals or regulated metal property, as such terms are defined in
- Code Section 10-1-350, and the <u>sum of the</u> aggregate amount of such property, in its
- original and undamaged condition, plus any reasonable costs which are or would be

- incurred in the repair or the attempt to recover any property damaged in the theft or removal of such regulated metal property, exceeds \$500.00, by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years, a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both."

- 64 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
