

Senate Resolution 333

**ADOPTED**

A RESOLUTION

1 Honoring certain outstanding Georgia citizens and designating certain state facilities in their  
2 memory; and for other purposes.

3 **PART I.**

4 WHEREAS, the memory of the late Lamar Mobley would be well served by naming a barn  
5 on the Di-Lane Plantation Wildlife Management Area after him; and

6 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to honor the memory of the late Lamar Mobley by  
7 naming a state building after him.

8 **PART II.**

9 WHEREAS, the memory of the late Johnny McGlamery would be well served by naming  
10 the Region 5, Statesboro office of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation after him; and

11 WHEREAS, Johnny McGlamery served the citizens of this State above and beyond the call  
12 of duty as a GBI agent and, for many years, as the Senior Inspector of the Region 5  
13 Statesboro office of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation; and

14 WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to honor the memory of this outstanding and dedicated  
15 public servant by naming a state building after him.

16 **PART III.**

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
18 GEORGIA that the barn located on the Di-Lane Plantation Wildlife Management Area is  
19 hereby designated as the Lamar Mobley Memorial Barn, and the Department of Natural  
20 Resources is authorized and directed to erect or attach a sign or plaque indicating the same.

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Region 5, Statesboro office of the Georgia Bureau  
22 of Investigation is hereby designated as the Johnny McGlamery Office, and the Georgia

23 Bureau of Investigation is authorized and directed to erect or attach a sign or plaque  
24 indicating the same.

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
26 and directed to transmit appropriate copies of this resolution to the Department of Natural  
27 Resources, the Board of Public Safety, the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, and the families  
28 of Lamar Mobley and Johnny McGlamery.
