AS PASSED SENATE

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To provide that the chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of Troup County shall be a 2 full-time position; to provide for the compensation and qualifications for such chief 3 magistrate; to repeal a certain local Act; to provide an effective date; to repeal conflicting 4 laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.
7 The chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of Troup County shall be a full-time position,
8 and such chief magistrate shall devote his or her full time to the duties of such office.

9 SECTION 2.
10 The chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of Troup County shall receive an annual salary
11 in the amount of \$95,000.00 to be paid in equal monthly or bimonthly installments from the
12 funds of the county. The chief magistrate shall be entitled to be reimbursed for actual

expenses incurred in the performance of his or her official duties in the same manner and rateas other county employees.

15 SECTION 3.
16 In addition to all other qualifications established by general law or applicable local
17 legislation, no person shall be elected chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of Troup
18 County unless, at the time of his or her election, he or she is an attorney and member in good
19 standing of the State Bar of Georgia.

SECTION 4.

21 An Act to provide for the compensation of the chief magistrate of the Magistrate Court of

22 Troup County, approved March 18, 1985 (Ga. L. 1985, p. 3817), is hereby repealed.
