## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Mr. Joe David Jackson; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens  
3 with the passing of Mr. Joe David Jackson in November, 2009; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson was a graduate of the University of Georgia and Mercer Law  
5 School and served for several years as associate general counsel to the State Bar of Georgia;

- 7 WHEREAS, known for his legal reasoning and sharp analytical skills, Mr. Jackson served  
8 as an Administrative Law Judge for the State Board of Workers' Compensation and, in 1992,  
9 joined the law firm of Goodman McGuffey Lindsey & Johnson, LLP as a partner; and
- 10 WHEREAS, he was known as a clear thinker and hard worker, as a man whose strong  
11 convictions were supported by meticulous research and careful consideration, and as an  
12 equitable, impartial leader whose decisions were governed by the rules of honesty and fair  
13 play; and
- 14 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith, Mr. Jackson was an active member of Cannon  
15 United Methodist Church, where he taught Sunday school and assisted in the church's  
16 production of its Passion Play and the Walk to Emmaus; and
- 17 WHEREAS, his sense of humor brightened the lives of his friends and coworkers, with  
18 legendary practical jokes and holiday gag gifts; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson was united in love and marriage to his adoring wife, Margaret, and  
20 was blessed with the love of three children, Maggie, Laura, and Charlie; and

21 WHEREAS, he was a person of magnanimous strengths with an unimpeachable reputation  
22 for integrity, intelligence, fairness, and kindness and, by the example he made of his life, he  
23 made this world a better place in which to live; and

24 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Mr. Jackson will long be remembered for  
25 his love of the University of Georgia Bulldogs, family, and friendship, and this loyal  
26 husband, father, neighbor, and friend will be missed by all who had the great fortune of  
27 knowing him.

28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
29 the members of this body join in honoring the life and memory of Mr. Joe David Jackson and  
30 express their deepest and most sincere regret at his passing.
