## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of the Honorable John H. Ruffin, Jr.; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia has lost one of her most distinguished public servants,
- 3 innovative legal minds, and civil rights advocates with the passing of the Honorable John H.
- 4 Ruffin, Jr.; and
- 5 WHEREAS, a native of Waynesboro, Georgia, Judge Ruffin earned his bachelor's degree
- 6 from Morehouse College and his law degree from Howard University School of Law and
- 7 was admitted to the Georgia Bar in 1961;
- 8 WHEREAS, Judge Ruffin was the first African American Chief Judge of the Court of
- 9 Appeals of Georgia, the first African American Superior Court Judge for the Augusta
- 10 Judicial Circuit, and the first African American member of the Augusta Bar Association; and
- 11 WHEREAS, during the nearly five decades Judge Ruffin practiced law and sat on the bench,
- 12 he was recognized with numerous awards and honors, including a Trailblazer Award from
- 13 Georgia Minority Judges, a Logan E. Bleckley Award for Judicial Excellence from the
- 14 Atlanta Bar Association, a Judicial Council Hall of Fame Award from the National Bar
- 15 Association, an Outstanding Service Award from the National Alumni Association of
- 16 Morehouse College, and a Man of the Year Award from the Augusta Branch of the NAACP;

- 18 WHEREAS, Judge Ruffin was an honest and dedicated public servant who strove for
- 19 excellence in all his endeavors and whose primary concern was always the fair and impartial
- 20 administration of justice; and
- 21 WHEREAS, his colleagues knew him as a clear thinker and hard worker, as a man whose
- strong convictions were supported by meticulous research and careful consideration, and as

23 an equitable, impartial leader whose decisions were governed by the rules of honesty and fair

- 25 WHEREAS, Judge Ruffin's leadership and guidance were instrumental to many civic and
- 26 professional organizations, including the Board of Trustees of the Institute of Continuing
- 27 Judicial Education of Georgia, the Georgia Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, the
- 28 Boys Club of Augusta, and the Voter Education Project, to name just a few; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Judge Ruffin leaves behind many who will cherish his memory and legacy,
- 30 including his loving wife, Judith; his son and daughter-in-law, Brinkley and Candace; and
- 31 his grandsons, Bryson and Myles; and
- 32 WHEREAS, an intelligent and compassionate man, Judge Ruffin will long be remembered
- 33 for his love family and friendship, and this loyal husband, father, grandfather, and jurist will
- 34 be missed by all who had the great fortune of knowing him; and
- 35 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of this trusted and enduring public figure,
- 36 a principled statesman and strong defender of the law with a sharp legal mind and a passion
- 37 for justice.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body
- 39 join to honor the life and achievements of the Honorable John H. Ruffin, Jr., express their
- 40 deepest regret at his passing, and extend their most sincere condolences to his family.
